#### **Special Services in Lent**

#### Sunday, February 14 at 10:30 a.m.

#### Palm/Passion Sunday (March 20) at 10:30 a.m.

Our Service will include the distribution of palms, and the Sacrament of Holy Communion as we celebrate Christ's triumphal entry into Jerusalem, and move towards the shadows of the cross.

#### Maundy Thursday (March 24) at 7:30 p.m.

Join us for a service reflecting the experience of the Upper Room. We will share a simple communion around the Table, experience gathering shadows, a "stripping of the altar", and leave in silence.

#### Good Friday (March 25) at 10:30 a.m.

We gather at the foot of the cross, as we experience the narrative of the passion.

# What's next in the Bible Seminar at EUC?

Since last September, I have been leading a monthly seminar centred on the Christian Bible as seen by United Church minister and Academic, the late Northrop Frye. Each session of the seminar is designed to be largely independent of the previous ones, so you can attend the discussion whenever you have the time and interest. The last session, particularly the repeat version on Sunday Jan. 17<sup>th</sup>, was well attended and supported a lively discussion about our United Church denomination's views of the scriptures.

Just look on the EUC website's events calendar to see the dates and venue for the monthly sessions. For anyone interested in the content of past sessions, please visit my website, <a href="www.frasercode.ca">www.frasercode.ca</a>, where full transcripts and a blog are posted.

- On Feb. 9<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup>, the seminar will focus on the literary aspects of the Bible, particularly on the story of Job ( see <a href="https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Job\_(biblical\_figure">https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Job\_(biblical\_figure</a>).
- On March 8<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>, the seminar will consider the Easter story, and how to approach it without resort to the supernatural or the magical aspect of literature (see <a href="https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Easter">https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Easter</a>).
- On April 12<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup>, the seminar will discuss the ideas behind concepts Heaven and Hell, the soul, the afterlife, and the real information the Bible gives about these subjects.
- Finally, on May 10<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>, the seminar will conclude with a discussion of the relation between Science and Religion, with a perspective of some modern authors, both scientists and theologians.

Remember, all are welcome. Come when you can. Catch up with the proceedings of the Web. But best of all, come and have your say about what it's like to be a Christian in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century who reads and thinks about the Bible!
