TOURNAMENT PLAY FOR ALL

Keen players are always eager to pit their skills against others, which is why the ACBL sanctions more than 1200 tournaments a year. If you want to play in a tournament, chances are good that you can find one just about any week of the year.

Sectional Tournaments are ACBL tournaments run by a unit or by a club to which authority for the activity has been granted by ACBL. Silver points are awarded in all events at a sectional. Most sectionals run for three days, although some are longer and a few run for only two days. Sectionals draw their competitors mostly from the immediate area.

Sectional Tournaments at Clubs (STaC) are ACBL tournaments with sectional rating staged at many clubs in a geographical area over a period of up to seven days. Events are played at several clubs, and results are transmitted to a central office manned by the director in

charge. The director combines the results to determine the winners and overall places for participants.

Masterpoints awarded are silver.

Regional Tournaments are ACBL tournaments run by the districts and offer gold and red points. At least one regional tournament is held in each district annually.

North American Bridge Championships (NABC) are conducted by the ACBL and are held three times a year across the United States and Canada. NABCs offer platinum, gold and red points.

Avoid the Beloved Finesse

Compliments to Eddie Kantar

We average players hold the finesse dear to our heart and cannot take them fast enough. Alas for us the expert avoids them like the plague to try and find an alternative.

- Finesses, particularly in short suits, are to be avoided. Take them as a last resort.
- Try to establish a long suit before taking finesses in short suits.
- With two finesses to choose from, try the long one first.
- Identify the danger opponent and finesse accordingly.
- Do not take two finesses when you only need one.
- 9 never, 8 ever is for beginners, only to be used when no information is forthcoming.

Some Examples:

Dummy	QJ105 1052 AQJ3 J2	You	AK9876 J43 65 AQ	Three hearts are played and then RHO plays club to you (hate him!). Play the ace, you need the diamond finesse to work to make the contract.
Dummy	J32 AQJ4 AQ5 QJ10	You	AK K109876 32 876	Opponents ruff the 3 rd club and exit with spade. After drawing trump play the second spade, maybe you get lucky and the Queen falls.
Dummy	AJ98 Q543 A76 32	You	KQ7654 J KJ2 AK4	Postpone the diamond finesse until you have drawn trump and ruffed two hearts. Who knows, you might get lucky and drop the other honor and your queen is good.



On Sunday, July 23rd at 10:30 am at the Sacramento Bridge Club, 25 bridge players attended **Gary Soules'** lecture: "Game Forcing Inverted Minor". Gary likes a bid of 1C by Opener, then 2C by Responder or 1D by Opener, then 2D by Responder to be Game Forcing (GF) or at least forcing to the 4 level of the minor. When the Responder bids 2 of the minor, Responder denies a 4-card major and has an opening hand.

So, after 1m-2m = GF or 4 level of minor,

Opener's rebids are: 2H = 4 Hs and the other minor stopped.

2S = 4 Ss and the other minor stopped.

2NT = Both majors stopped. Maybe Opener has the other minor

stopped also, but doesn't promise it.

3 of the other minor = That minor stopped, but no major stopped.

3 of the same minor = 1 major stopped.

Jump in a major = Singleton

Double jump in other minor = Singleton

Examples:

(a) 1D-2D

3H = Singleton H

(b) 1C-2C

3D = Singleton D

(c) 1D-3D

4C = Singleton C

Invitational hands bid by jump shifting to the other minor:

Examples: (a) 1C-2D = Invitational. Responder has support for clubs.

It says nothing about Responder's diamonds.

(b) 1D-3C = Invitational. Responder has support for diamonds.

It says nothing about Responder's clubs.

Preemptive hands are jumps in the same minor:

Examples: (a) 1C-3C and (b) 1D-3D

On Sunday, July 30th, Jim Houghton gave a 1 hour lecture on Defense. He noted that defense is used on about 50% of the hands we play. Jim illustrated his lecture with 10 hands from Eddie Kantar's, Defensive Bridge Play Complete, a book Jim used when learning defense about 40 years ago.



Jim discussed Dummy Type and what leads the defenders should make.

- 1. If dummy has a balanced hand with no 4-card suit that can be established for discard (s), then make a Passive lead.
- 2. If dummy has ruffing power, but little else, make trump leads.
- 3a. If dummy has a long usable side suit, defenders should establish their own tricks before declarer can use dummy's side suit, or kill dummy's entry before trumps have been drawn.
- 3b. If dummy's side suit is not usable, then lead trumps or go passive.
