Arena Events

Throwing-the-Tyre Contest

This event is for car clubs — each car club entering will need to field a team of five members. The idea is to throw a tyre from one point to another (approximately 50 yards) without the tyre touching the ground. Both the individual throwing the tyre and the individual catching it must be standing still, what the other members of

the team are doing meanwhile is up to them, but each member of the team must throw and catch the tyre at least once.

Entry is 'on the day' and must be made by 11am (in the arena). The contest begins at 11.15am.

Swinging Sixties Contest

This competition is basically for the best 'mini-skirt' and car of the sixties. The girl can be accompanied by an appropriately dressed male partner, but this is not essential. The car, preferably, should be a Mini, or a sports car, again this is not essential, but the girl in the

mini-skirt should be the one driving the car. (We are not quite sure who thought this one up, but whoever he is he has been keeping very quiet).

Entry is 'on the day' and should be made to the table in the arena by 11am. The parade is at 11.45am.



Tug-a-Car Competition

This is for car club teams and was so well received last year that it is back again 'by popular demand'. We are expecting to have two A35's available for towing and each team must consist of five members, one to steer and the other four to 'tug'. At the end of each tug (from one side of the arena to the other) the car must be stopped with its rear wheels on the finishing line.

Entry is 'on the day' and must be made in the arena by 11.15am. The heats take place at 12.15pm and the finals at 2.30pm.

Teddy Boy/Girl and Car Parade

This competition was a huge success last year and we expect even more entries this year. Suitably attired Teddy Boys and/or Teddy Girls, with an appropriate car of the period will parade in the arena to the sound of music evocative of the '50s.

Entry is 'on the day' and should be made in the arena by 1pm. The parade is at 1.45pm.

Pick of the Show Parade

This year the 'pick of the show' parade will take place after the prize giving at 4.30pm. The parade gives us the chance to show, and explain some of the vehicles we feel are of particular interest, they will not be the prize winners, but they will be some of the more notable Pageant entries.

Parade of Mercedes Benz 300SL's

As a very special addition to this years' arena displays we will be hoping to have a parade of all the Mercedes Benz 300SL's, which will include the 14 cars from Germany. This parade is scheduled for 3.30pm.





Home Tune Hot Air Balloon

Weather permitting we will see the dramatic shape of the Home Tune hot air balloon ascended over the Pageant, at the far end of the one make parking area.

The balloon measures 75 feet in height and can carry three people. It is piloted by professional balloon 'pilots' and is operated by the Hot-Air Balloon Companyy on behalf of Home Tune, the world's largest mobile car tuning service.

Arena Events

Prize Giving

This will take place at about 4.30pm and will take about 30 minutes, with the prize winners doing a lap of the arena to collect their prizes. This should

ensure that everyone has a chance to see the best of the show. Melvyn Dunster will be handling and commentating on the prize giving.

Club team awards

Les Pickett is adding to his trophy for first prize £50 cash to the winners, Practical Classics are adding a further £100 to this, making a total cash prize to the winning club of £150. In addition Practical Classics are giving a cash prize of £50 to the runners up. As well as these prizes each member of the winning team receives his own individual trophy and there are trophies for the individual members of the second and third placed teams.

Model Racing

This year the Eden Park Overlanders, one of the leading model car racing clubs in the country have designated their race meeting at the Bromley Pageant as a 'National' meeting, which will include one of this year's Grand Prix races. The Bromley Pageant is honoured by this distinction and we are also hoping to organise a special 'Editors and Journalists' race along similar lines to the one held last year, when some motoring writers discovered just how skillful model car racing really is.



The Eden Park Overlanders club has been running for just over three years and they meet twice monthly, one meeting being a trophy/club championship meeting. The juniors in the club also compete for their own championship.

The club are able to run up to eight cars in each heat, due to the different crytal frequencies. The rules and regulations are nationwide having been laid down by the British Radio-Controlled Car Association. The club will always be happy to talk to anyone at the Pageant who feels they might like to take up model car racing.

'Dinky' Concours

Once again there will be a 'Dinky' concours at the Pageant of Motoring. The Triumph Razor Edge Club on stand C19 will be organising it, entry is on the day and entries must be in by 3pm, and rules of enry are as follows:

1. 'Dinky' only, or 'Corgi', 'Spot-on',

- 'Matchbox', etc. Original or modified. NO kits.
- Models to be representative of vehicles exhibited at show.
- 3. Entry fee 10p per model.
- 4. Entries to the Triumph Razor Edge Club stand from 10am to 3pm.
- Judging to commence at 3.30pm and will be based on: a) General condition. b) Standard of finish. c) Accuracy in relation to full sized vehicle. d) Realistic detailing where appropriate.
- All entries to be collected from the TROC by 5pm.
- Neither the TROC, or Practical Classics can accept responsibility for loss or damage to entries.

A winners trophy and one runners up prize will be awarded.


Childrens Amusements
