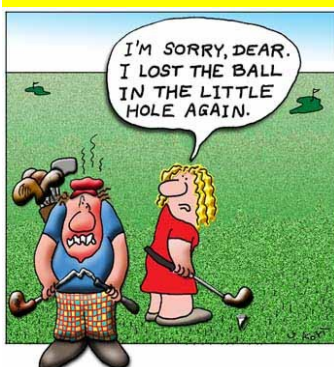

### 5. Random Petanque Rule

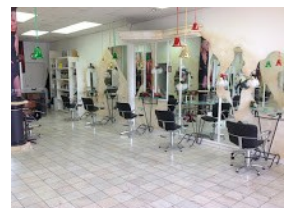
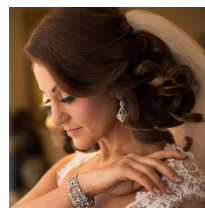

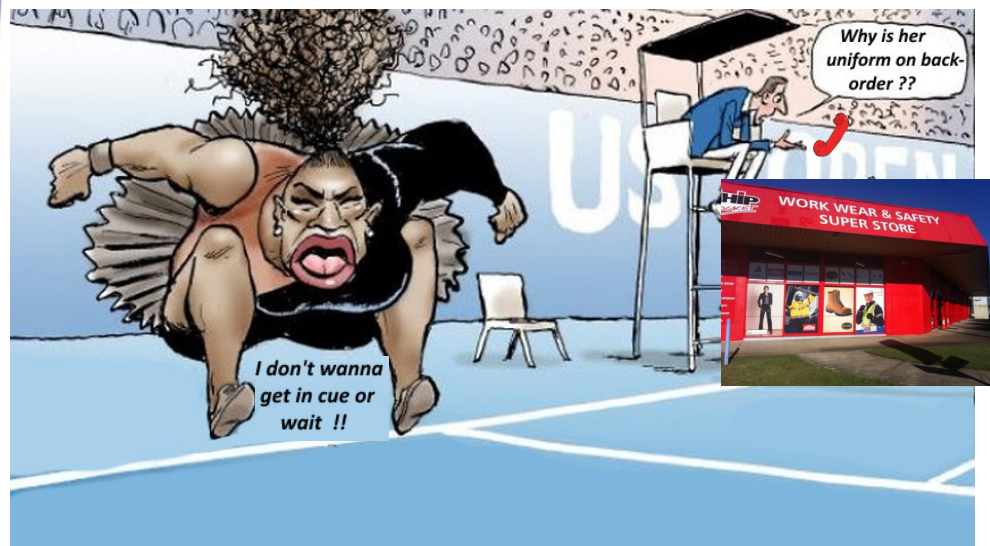

## **THE HISTORY OF OUR BOWLING CLUB**

Our Bowling Club has a very unique history.

It began in 1949 when the Myer Emporium in Adelaide acquired 10 acres of land from the Adelaide Polo Club at Plympton to establish a recreation ground for their employees. A clubhouse was built, a full size football and cricket oval, two lawn tennis courts, two hard courts, three basketball courts and a bowling green. The clubhouse was furnished and had two full size billiard tables. A residential house was built on the premises and an employee of Myer, Mr. Clem Wright, was appointed resident caretaker/greenkeeper. Floodlighting was installed for night matches. All maintenance and upkeep was paid for by the Myer Emporium.

On 11<sup>th</sup> November 1950 the Myer Staff Sports Ground was officially opened by the Managing Director of Myer, Mr. James Martin. Myer teams were entered in all sports and became very competitive. Some of our State players in various sports started their careers with the Myer Club. The Myer staff cricket team always had a Sheffield Shield player among its eleven (a handy advantage when playing Myer Melbourne). Knowledgeable commentators agreed that its turf wicket was the best in the state apart from the one on Adelaide Oval.

On 11<sup>th</sup> October 1952 Dame Merlyn Myer opened the Myer Emporium Bowling Club green and rolled the first bowl. Myer entered men's pennant bowls in the 6<sup>th</sup> Division and within 6 years rose to 1<sup>st</sup> Division.

In 1960 the Myer Women's Bowling Club was formed. Eligible members would be wives and daughters of the Myer Men's Bowling Club and women employees of the Myer Emporium (S.A.) Ltd. A fee of ten shillings for the season entitled each member to an Association badge and also paid for Capitation Fees and Subscription to the S.A.W.B.A. The next year, with increased membership, Myer Women became very competitive and achieved very much the same results as the men.

In 1976 The Myer S.A. Stores were taken over by the Myer Melbourne establishment which decided that the sporting complex in South Australia had become a "white elephant" because of the urban development. The sports people had drifted away and the only permanent sport competitively played was lawn bowls during summer, although some small number of staff played at times on the amenities provided.

The property was sold to a private developer who assured the Bowling Club that they could remain operational until such time as the property was developed on the condition that the bowling Club paid all rates, taxes and maintenance on the area.

It was decided by the Myer Club to accept these conditions. Until then all maintenance and expenses had been met by the Myer emporium. Now the Club realised that it would have to start fundraising to pay for the upkeep.

The Myer Club membership originally had been restricted to staff, with a small number of relations and people connected with the National Bank. The Club was now open to the public for membership. Many people then jumped at the opportunity to join this very special and unique Club.

During the next ten years membership increased to 125 men and women.

With the Club's lease due to expire in 1989, the Club began looking for an alternative location, rather than be forced to close. An opportunity arose when Holdfast Bay Women's Bowling Club decided to vacate their premises in the Camden Trust area and amalgamate with the Holdfast Bay Men's Bowling Club at Glenelg. The Myer Bowling Club decided to take over their greens when they vacated them.

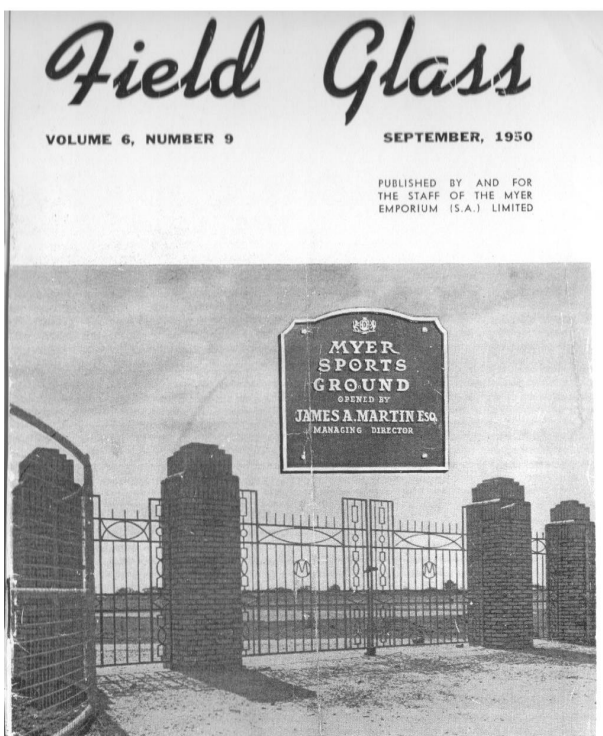
Approval was passed by the Camden Trust and the West Torrens Council for the Bowling Club to build a new Clubhouse on the property.

In 1988 it was decided by the Myer Bowling Club to change its name to the Novar Gardens Bowling Club Inc. prior to moving to the new site. A new badge was designed bearing the logo of gum leaves beneath a bowl on a green background.

With the enthusiasm of knowing they were working for their own Club, members proceeded to demolish the old buildings and with the help of experienced Club members, plans for the new Clubhouse were drawn up and finance arranged. The Club was fortunate to find that they had some of the best tradespeople as members who were willing to give their time and skills or lend a hand, thus saving the Club considerable expenses.

In 1989 enthusiastic members moved into their new Clubrooms.

The Club is proud of its members, past and present, for what they achieved. Whether the Club numbers grow or remain static, members will always be assured of the best endeavours of the Club to accommodate their needs.

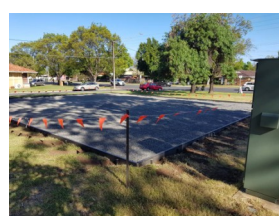
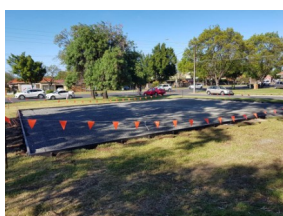
## Petanque Piste Expansion Update

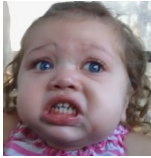

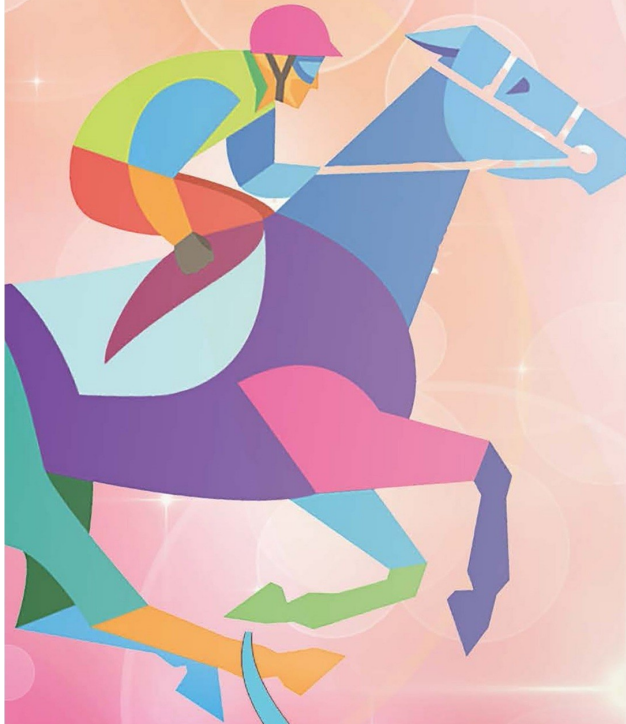
