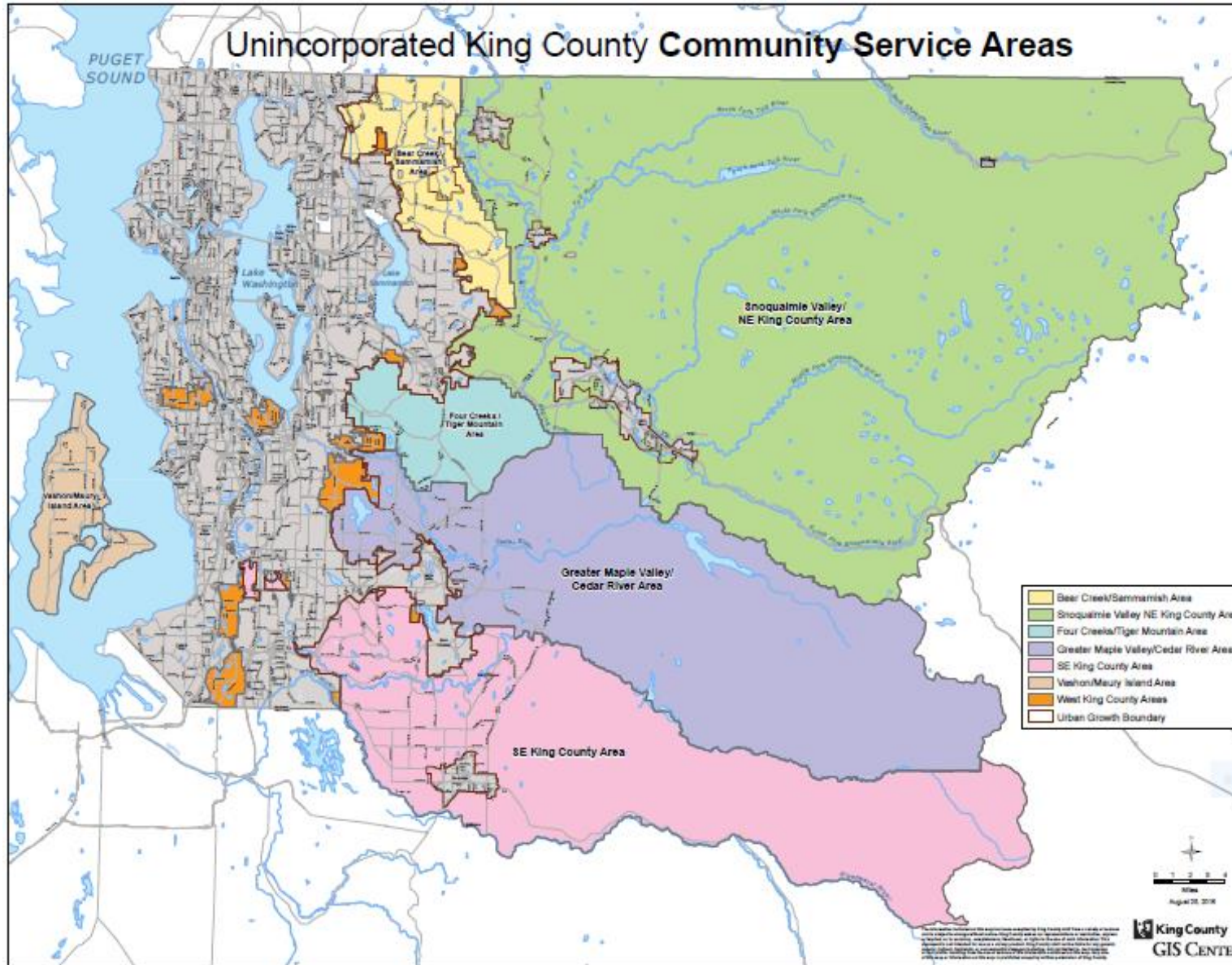
## Guiding Principles:

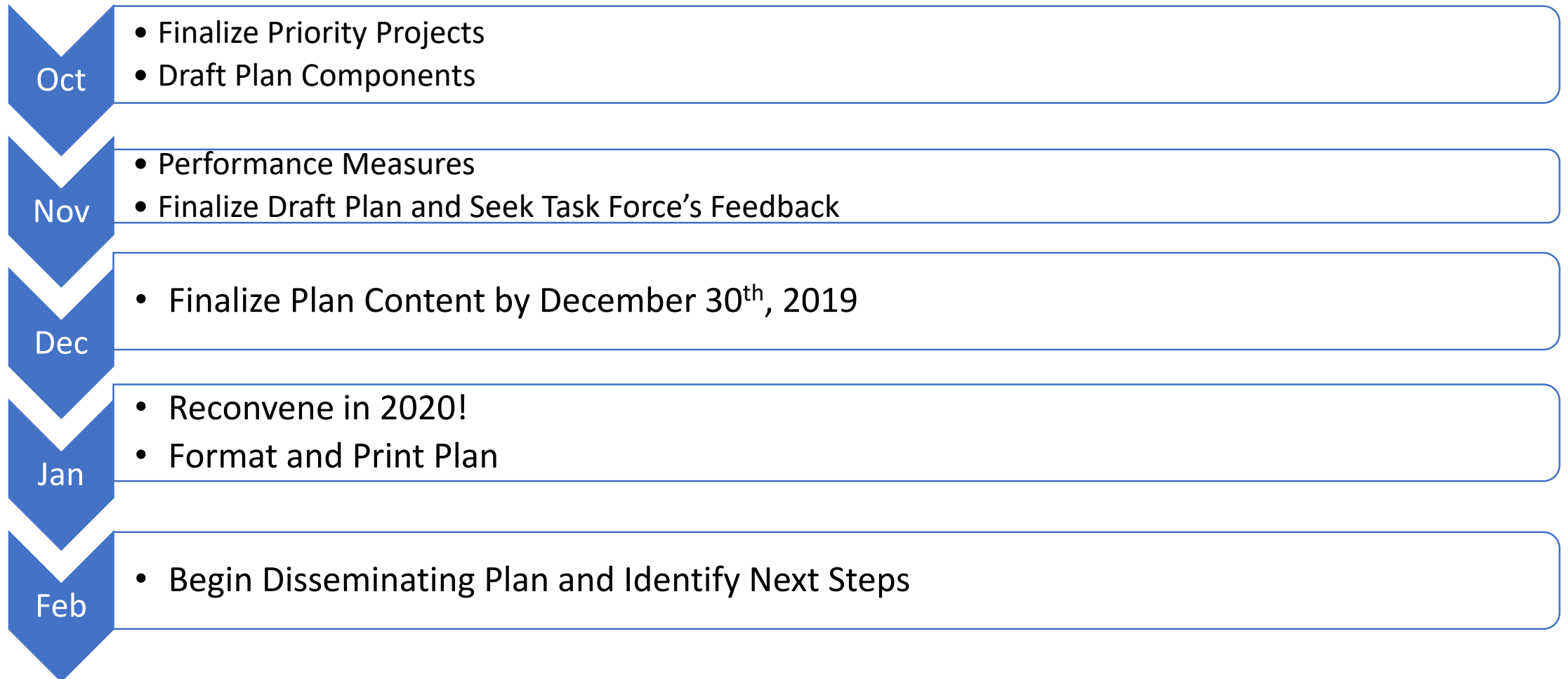
