

2020 Achievements

- Hosted six bi-monthly meetings in North King County with an average attendance of 16 participants per meeting, and 21 active members. *An active coalition member is an individual who has attended at least two coalition meetings in one calendar year.*
- At bimonthly coalition meetings, hosted presentations from Community Transit, King County Metro about both the Subsidized Annual Pass and North Link Expansion, the Regional Alliance for Resilient & Equitable Transportation (RARET), Hopelink Mobile Market, and the Puget Sound Regional Council.
- Enhanced membership by adding fourteen partners to the coalition distribution list in 2020. Four partners became active coalition members.
- Concluded the 2020 North King County Gaps Analysis Project, a comprehensive needs assessment that aims to “understand the mobility challenges in the North King County region for populations with special needs, and in doing so better coordinate members and service providers to facilitate mobility improvement projects.”
- Participated in stakeholder groups including the North Urban Human Services Alliance (NUHSA), Snohomish County Transportation Coalition SNOTRAC), King County Mobility Coalition (KCMC), and the Community Living Connections Network.
- Connected groups such as the Shoreline School District to transportation providers to meet unique transportation needs due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Represented special needs transportation interests on the King County Metro Mobility Framework review board, a taskforce of community partners that aims to shape key updates in the new Metro Mobility Framework.
