



2020 Achievements

- In response to COVID-19 RARET produced weekly Impact Summaries which explained providers' level of operations, emerging needs, and resources. RARET also facilitated bi-weekly partner meetings at the individual county level to discuss emerging needs and share best practices/lessons learned. Lastly, RARET facilitated a Resiliency Roundtable event which focused on specific strategies to increase transportation resiliency as a region and had 61 people in attendance.
- Hosted six meetings (5 virtual) with an average attendance of 29 participants.
- Enhanced membership by adding 27 partners to the coalition distribution list in 2020, 10 of which became active RARET members (attends 1/3 of meetings).
- At bimonthly workgroup meetings, RARET hosted presentations from Hopelink Mobility Management's One-Call/One-Click project, Snoqualmie Valley Transportation Coalition's 5 Year Transportation Plan, as well as Pierce and Snohomish County Departments of Emergency Management.
- Continued producing the monthly RARET newsletters and increased the number of contacts from 80 to 188.

- Established RARET's Steering Committee which provided guidance to the group and convened 6 times in 2020.
- RARET staff support presented on the workgroup at the National Center for Mobility Management, Coalition on Inclusive Emergency Planning, King County NEMT Providers, and to all Hopelink Mobility Management Coalitions.
