

Mission Statement

The South King County Mobility Coalition continuously identifies and initiates coordinated, creative, sustainable ways to assist individuals, including older adults, youth, persons with disabilities, limited English speakers, Veterans, and low-income individuals in South King County reach their potential by increasing their transportation options. The Coalition works to share current information on needs, trends, and events relevant to mobility within the region.

2020 presented unprecedented challenges. Our region still has plenty of work ahead as we recover from this year and continue the work of sharing information and assisting community members in accessing resources. The following achievements demonstrate our teamwork, resiliency, and creativity.

2020 Achievements

- 15 SKCMC members attended at least 2 of the meetings in 2020.
- The coalition had 5 additions to our distribution list representing: Port of Seattle, Seattle Goodwill, MV Transportation, and South Sound Alliance.
 - Increased SKCMC distribution list from 82 to 87.

Coalition Meetings

- Hosted six (6) meetings in South King County with an average attendance of fifteen (15) participants per meeting.
- Adapted meetings to a virtual format, remaining connected during Covid-19
- At bimonthly coalition meetings we covered a diverse set of topics and hosted presentations from several regional partners. 2020 meetings included:
 - Tukwila Community Connections;
 - Reviewing the transportation programs of: Sound Generations, King County Metro, Sound Transit and Catholic Community Services;
 - Project Updates for the Care Mobility Rewards Program;
 - the Regional Alliance for Resilient and Equitable Transportation (RARET) Workgroup's response to the Covid-19;
 - the City of Tukwila Transit Demand Management Program SKC Trips;
 - Updates regarding King County Metro service changes and outreach efforts;
 - Updates regarding Puget Sound Regional Council's Transportation Plan particularly the special needs transportation element.

Member Engagement and Outreach

- Participated in five (5) stakeholder groups including the South King County Food Access Working Group, Greater Renton Human Service Providers, South King County Food Coordination, Metro Transit Policy Update workgroup, and South King County Health Coalition.
- Conducted a formal presentation on coalition's mission, vision, and past and current projects at the South King County Health Coalition.
- Provided weekly email updates and announcements on transportation-related news, region-specific announcements, and relevant resources.

Projects and Partnerships

- In partnership with Valley Medical Hospital, completed the pilot, [Care Mobility Rewards Program](#). The pilot provided transportation service for older adults in South King County for their post-hospitalization medical appointments and wellness care needs. Despite challenges presented by the pandemic and community shut down, the pilot was successful in serving community member needs. Findings and recommendations will be shared in a post-pilot report shared out with the coalition.
- SKCMC staff supported community outreach and mobility education projects with the city of Tukwila's South King County Trips program and with King County Metro's Renton, Kent, Auburn area mobility plan. These projects provided information and resources to community members so that they may be mobile, healthy, and safe.
