'My Mom Gave Me Away'

Applause mingled with tears as a rapt audience heard PTF graduate Gregory Dillon relate his journey to freedom. Dillon told an audience of judges, preachers and civic leaders of a childhood fraught with physical and emotional abuse and his descent into a sordid life of using and selling drugs.

"I came from a dysfunctional family," Dillon said. "In a drug deal gone wrong, my mom gave me away. I dealt with physical and mental abuse. As I grew older I followed my parents' footsteps. All I knew how to do was to sell drugs and use drugs."

And, he went on, finally to a life-saving transformation.

"It was hope," he said of what he found at PTF. "Some of us never had hope."

I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live (John 11:25).

B'nai Israel, which made PTF founder Scott McLean its 2018 recipient. The award, named for a former member who dedicated her life to making a difference, each year honors an Arkansas citizen who exhibits the qualities she demonstrated. From opening churches in Russia to conducting ministries in the inner cities of New York state, McLean said, he always felt called to help others move toward a brighter future.

"Your purpose will find you," he said.

McLean served as the InnerChange Freedom Initiative reentry manager in Kansas from 2000-05. He also served as the director of that program in Arkansas from 2006-11. "Who would have imagined I would spend 18 years in prison with 200 inmates. Now I don't have any hair," McLean said with a laugh.

But it was Dillon who held the crowd spellbound with his account of a life transformed by the Lord, who used PTF as His vehicle. Representing the many who have found a new way through the program, Dillon told the assembly of his rehabilitation as a father to his children, a manager in his company and an associate pastor in his church.

"This was not just a program, it was a new way of living," he said. "I know I can't have a new beginning, but I

can start over and have a new ending," Dillon said as applause rippled through the room. It was left to McLean to explain that such profound change does not occur by chance. "We aren't just a Bible study," he said. "We don't just sit by the fire and sing 'Kumbaya.' We hold these guys accountable and address the risk factors."
