CID Information Update

A meeting was held October 3, with utilities, New Mexico Oil and Gas Association, New Mexico Public Regulation Commission (NMPRC) staff, and Regulation and Licensing Superintendent Mike Unthank, as well as Deputy Superintendent Pat McMurray with the Construction Industries Division (CID).

The CID still needs to determine which facilities will no longer be inspected by CID, and they believe they don't have jurisdiction to inspect on federal properties. CID is working to get agreements that would give them authority to inspect on federal properties from federal entities such as the Bureau of Land Managment, Bureau of Reclamation and the U.S. Forest Service. However, getting a settled proposal for the inspection of oil and gas facilities is a higher priority.

The process for the current proposal for oil and gas inspections will have customer-owned facilities installed by a licensed New Mexico contractor and then have the facilities inspected by a third party inspector. A form will be required to be signed by both the contractor and the third party inspector.

The deadline to have processes in place was October 31.
