MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES

July 14, 2020

The Marion County Quorum Court held its regular meeting on July 14, 2020.

Justice Shipman gave the invocation and Justice Mayo led the pledge.

County Judge John Massey presided over the meeting. All Justices were present, with the exception of Justice McCalla.

The minutes of the June meeting were approved.

All reports were given and passed unanimously.

During the Law Enforcement report, Justice Nickels asked Sheriff Evans, if he had given any thought about housing federal inmates. Sheriff stated that they had just been talking about that earlier in the day and he was looking into the cost of housing the prisoners versus how much money would actually be coming in.

Unfinished Business:

Justice Vancuren stated that at the last budget committee meeting, he had disagreed with Dawn Flippin (from the Sheriff's Department) on whether or not during the budget process that the Sheriff's office had been told to reduce the amount of the electricity so that their budget would be balanced. Justice Vancuren said that he had listened to the recording of the November 5, 2019 budget meeting and apologized to Ms. Flippin, as the recording proved that indeed the committee had asked her to do that.

Justice Vancuren made a motion that the July 16 budget committee meeting be postponed for a week. He stated that this will give the opportunity for the Sheriff and his representatives to visit the Lawrence County facility, to see how they are managing things there. Justice Brigham seconded the motion. The motion passed with Justice Mayo voting against it.

New Business:

Ordinance 2020-32 - Various Offices - Easing Spending Out of County General for the Rest of 2020 - Sponsored by the Budget Committee. This ordinance provides for the Child Support Fees Fund (3012) and the Recorder's Fund (3006) to appropriate the money to pay two deputies and the Clerk out of these funds until the end of 2020. It also allows for the Collector to pay one of her deputies out of the Collector's Automation Fund (3001). Collector Brightwell will pay for one deputy out of the fund as long as she is in office. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-33 – County Building Fund – Appropriations – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance appropriates \$38,000 of the County Building Improvement Fund (3403) to repair the roof of the Annex Building and to pay Tony Davenport for the Covid screens. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously.

Resolution 2020-2 – Treasurer Ron McPherson Retirement – Sponsored by Justice McCalla and Mayo. This resolution declares a vacancy in the Marion County Treasurers Office as of August 1, 2020, as Treasurer Ron McPherson is retiring on July 31, 2020. This resolution also calls for Carla Purdome to be appointed to fulfill McPherson's term which expires December 31, 2022. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice Nickels. During discussion Justice Scrima asked if there could be a three month probation period, after which Ms. Purdome's performance would be evaluated. County Attorney Sam Pasthing stated that according to his research once the appointment has been made it is made. Justice Brigham questioned Ms. Purdome if she had considered that the Budget Committee had requested that no open spots would be filled. Ms. Purdome stated that she could not run that office by herself. Justice Vancuren called for the question and Justice Scrima seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. The motion to adopt was called and passed with Justice Scrima abstaining.

Resolution 2020-3 – ADEQ – Clean Up Transfer Station – Sponsored by Justice Madden. This resolution is a year call for the County Judge to sign a promissory note for \$5,500 with First Service Bank to clean up the transfer station in the event that it is closed or abandoned. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice Vancuren. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Judge John Massey announced that he had appointed Eddie White to the Marion County Planning Board. The motion to ratify the appointment was unanimous.

Justice Scrima stated that Eddie Jones, from AAC, is willing to give a class regarding the budget process for the elected officials and Justices. It is a two to three hour class and the cost would only be the cost of fuel.

The meeting was adjourned.

MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES

Special Meeting

July 29, 2020

The Marion County Quorum Court held a special meeting on July 29, 2020, to discuss the on going budget situation in County General.

The prayer was led by Justice Brigham, and the Pledge by Justice Madden.

County Judge John Massey led the meeting. All justices with the exception of Justices Shipman and Scrima.

The ordinance to cut 10% across the board in County General was pulled by County Judge Massey.

Ordinance 2020-34 – 911 Fund Appropriations – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance will provide three dispatchers to be paid from Fund 3020 – Marion County 911. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice Vancuren. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-35 – To Delete Open Positions from County General Number and Compensation and a Wage Freeze – Sponsored by the Budget Committee. This ordinance allows for the removal of any open positions in County General numbers and compensation. Any positions that become vacant, will not be filled without permission of the Quorum Court. During the discussion portion for this ordinance, Justice Vancuren explained that over projections of revenues, and the carryover being added in twice, was the reason that County General is in trouble. County Judge Massey stated that the hiring freeze would not effect appointed Treasurer Carla Purdom, from filing the position created after her appointment and Ron McPherson's retirement. County Attorney, Sam Pasthing pointed out that the Metro positions are contracted and is dedicated revenue and therefore should also be allowed to be filled as needed. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Brigham. The motion passed unanimously.

There will be another Budget committee meeting on August 5 at 5:30 at the annex.

Justice Vancuren made a motion to be in recess until the August 11 Quorum Court meeting. Justice Brigham seconded. The motion passed unanimously.

The meeting was recessed.



It will also ping the phones if they send a text to 911. Soon iphone users will have the ability to opt-in to send information from their medical ID to 911 during an emergency. This is just an additional tool that will help us be able to locate someone that is unable to tell us where they are.

MARION COUNTY Budget Meeting July 23, 2020

Chairman Joyce McCalla called the meeting to order at 5:34 pm. The topic of the Sheriff's budget was mentioned but the subject of the AAC meeting with Eddie Jones was discussed. Justice VanCuren and Justice Scrima have been working on the 2020 budget to see where there are problems. Justice VanCuren started elaborating on the findings; he stated that as of July 23, we are \$590,000 short attributed to over projected revenues, not insuring the 105 set back was in place, many employees in the county receiving pay raises and passing a budget that wasn't correct. Justice VanCuren offered 6 actions to target the problem: 1) every office in the county needs to cut 10% from their budget, 2) raise taxes, 3) move funds from other county offices to the sheriff's budget, 4) cut staff if other options fail to address the shortfall, 5) cut every office's special fund budget forcing that office to use their special funds and (6 shut down the jail and ship inmates to other jails. The justice added these are only recommendations. Sheriff Evans explained that shutting down the jail was not an option and that with the Covid-19 virus; inmates may not be accepted by other counties. He added that the housing costs and transportation to court, medical appointments and various other reasons, would quickly deplete the savings. The Sherriff added, that state statute ACA14-14-802 states that the County Quorum Court must provide for law enforcement and a jail. The sheriff also added that statute also he shall have custody of the jail and its prisoners in his or her county. Justice VanCuren stated that an ordinance should be passed requiring a hiring freeze, freeze all salaries and not filling any open positions. Also, he stated, we need an ordinance to adjust the 2020 budget and eliminating numbers and comps of unfilled positions. Justice VanCuren added the \$590,000. figure is non-negotiable and these ordinances are to help Marion County rebound from the financial problems the county is experiencing. He added the sheriff would need to cut \$220,000 from his budget. Sheriff Evans responded that to cut \$220,000 would be impossible and still pay the bills. VanCuren questioned, would \$140,000 be possible? The Sheriff responded by stating the department would be operating at minimum employees and services. Chairman Joyce McCalla addressed the issue of the treasurer's office and Carla Purdome being the only employee with Treasurer Ron McPherson retiring and she is able to hire an employee. The committee offered a possible agreement to cross-train another

employee from another department.

Justice VanCuren added that additional Quorum Court meetings may be required, as the date of July 29, in the courthouse at 6 pm was selected.
