#### MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES

November 17, 2020

The Marion County Quorum Court postponed its regular meeting, which would have been on November 10 at 6:00 p.m., and rescheduled it for November 2020, at the Marion County Courthouse.

Judge John Massey presided over the meeting. All Justices were present with the exception of Justice Madden.

Clerk Dawn Moffet offered the prayer, and Justice Mayo led the Pledge.

The minutes were approved as were all reports given.

Under old business, the petition regarding the Peel Fire Department was revisited. Justice Scrima announced that the state had changed the procedure of converting from a Fire Department to a Protection District. The Department now, simply has to present the petition to the Quorum Court. During the September meeting the Peel Fire Department did indeed present the petition to the Quorum Court to become the Peel Fire Protection District. Justice Scrima made a motion to approve the petition. Justice Mayo seconded, and the motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

#### **New Business**

Ordinance 2020-63 – Clerk's Office – Transfer of Money – Sponsored by Justice White, Mayo and Scrima. This ordinance moves \$1000, from one category to another. From 1000-0102-4004 – Machinery and Equipment to 10000-0102-3102 – Computer Support. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-64 – Millage – Sponsored by Justices Mayo, McCalla and Scrima. This ordinance is passed every year to levy the taxes for the following year. To motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion was passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-65 – Election Reimbursement Appropriation – Sponsored by Justice Mayo and Scrima. The county received the reimbursement from the State of Arkansas for the 2020 Primary election in the amount of \$25686.95. This ordinance appropriates the money into Extra Help Per Diem, General Office,



Postage and Meals, Miles and Lodging. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Nickels and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-66 – Treasurer – Correcting Receipting Error – Sponsored by Justice McCalla. This ordinance amends an entry error that was made while receipting monies on receipt number 26363, per auditor Celetha Smith. So, \$18094.59 is to be transferred from 1803 Sales Tax – Fire Departments and moved to 1802 Sales Tax – Solid Waste. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion was passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-67 – E-911 – Overtime Line Item – Sponsored by Justices Madden and McCalla. This ordinance creates a line item for overtime and moves \$4000.00 from full time into overtime, FICA and retirement line items. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-68 – E-911 – Amending Numbers and Compensation – Sponsored by Justice Madden. This ordinance outlines the new position of E-911 Addressing/Dispatcher. Maximum salary will be \$15 per hour and will be paid from 3020-0501 along with the other dispatchers and coordinator. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-69 – CARES Act Grant – Sponsored by Justices Mayo, Brigham, White and McCalla. The motion to read by title only was made by Justice McCalla and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote. This ordinance allow for the establishment of a sub-fund of County General to be call the Coronavirus Relief Fund. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-70 – Assessor & Collector's Office – Refunds – Sponsored by Justices White, McCalla and Mayo. This ordinance refunds an overpayment in taxes to Thomas Myers in the amount of \$20.33 and Housley Services in the amount of \$9277.08. As this has been done by court orders previously, this ordinance was amended to include the copies of the court orders which show the breakdown of the refunds. The motion to amend was made by Justice Vancuren and seconded by Justice Mayo. The motion passed unanimously. The motion to adopt the amended ordinance was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-71 – Juvenile Intake – Appropriation – Sponsored by Justices Madden, McCalla, and Mayo. This ordinance appropriates the deposits for Auxiliary Travel in the amount of \$2220.99 into the line item 1000-0415-3073 Lease Machinery & Equipment. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice Nickels. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-72 – Sheriff's Office – Arvest Donation – Sponsored by Justices McCalla, Shipman and Madden. This ordinance appropriates a donation of \$12000.00 to the small equipment line item, in order for the department to purchase new body cameras. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-73 – Clerk's Office – Recorders Fund – Sponsored by Justices Mayo, White, McCalla and Scrima. This ordinance simply moves money from the full time line item into the overtime line item to cover a shortage due to the election. The motion to adopt was made by Justice McCalla and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-74 – Treasurer's Office – Excess Treasurer's Commission – Sponsored by Justice Scrima. After this ordinance was read, there was no motion to adopt. Thus there could not be any discussion. The ordinance failed for no response.

Ordinance 2020-75 – Health Department – Other Professional Services – Sponsored by Justice Madden and McCalla. This ordinance moves \$9500.00 from 3403 the County Building Improvement Fund into the Other Professional Services line item for the Health Department for the purpose of purchasing a new phone system for the Department. The motion to adopt was made by Justice McCalla and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed unanimously.

The meeting was adjourned.
