BE IT RESOLVED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF MARION COUNTY, STATE OF ARKANSAS, A RESOLUTION TO BE ENTITLED:

A RESOLUTION ADOPTED IN FURTHERANCE OF THE CARES ACT AND IN RESPONSE TO THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security Act ("CARES") Act was passed by Congress and signed by the President on March 27, 2020, to provide fast relief and response to the COVID-19 pandemic emergency;

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Arkansas, the General Assembly and Cares Act Steering Committee have authorized the application for grants and use of funds for use in responding and providing relief for the COVID-19 pandemic emergency, including the supporting and funding for hazard pay for certain public safety employees of counties and cities potentially exposed to COVID-19 in the performance of their public safety duties in response to COVID-19;

WHEREAS, jailers, transport officers, certified law enforcement officers, bailiffs, coroners employed by the county may be recognized as public safety officers under the CARES Act as part of the front line response to CVOID-19, due to their day to day and activities;

WHEREAS, certified law enforcement officers employed by this county are hereby acknowledged as public safety officers for purposes of the CARES Act, they are potentially exposed to CVOID-19 in the performance of their day to day duties as law enforcement officers in: their response to calls for their assistance, making arrests, booking and transporting detainees, conducting investigation, making traffic stops, tending to courthouse screenings, performing bailiff functions, administering crowd control, enforcing laws and enforcing COVID-19 directives;

WHEREAS, the jailers and transport officers employed by this county are hereby acknowledged as public safety officers for purposes of the CARES Act and potentially exposed to CVOID-19, due to their day to day activities in: booking, transporting, moving and segregating detainees within the jail--and to and from the county jail, state penitentiaries or courthouses;

WHEREAS, the coroner and deputy coroners employed by this county are hereby acknowledged as public safety officers for purposes of the CARES Act and potentially exposed to CVOID-19, due to their day to day activities in: investigating the cause and manner of deaths, conducting and administering test for COVID-19 of the deceased, and in transportation and examination of the deceased;

WHEREAS, the 911 dispatchers and law enforcement dispatchers employed by this county may be recognized as public safety officers under the CARES Act and are hereby acknowledged as potentially exposed to COVID-19 due to their day to day work within close proximity to persons arrested, booked and detained with the county jail facility;

WHEREAS; the Quorum Court is resolved and hereby supports the application for the hazard pay for the aforementioned public safety employees of this county, recognized as such for purposes of the CARES Act, due to front line role in response to the COVID-19 pandemic, and their acknowledged potential exposure to COVID-19;

WHEREAS; if the application for CARES Act funds submitted by the county is approved and funds received, in whole or in part, for these potentially exposed public safety employees under the CARES Act, the Quorum Court is resolved to adopt an appropriation ordinance for hazard pay for these specifically eligible public safety employees to the extent the funding request is granted and received from Cares Act funding;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE QUORUM COURT OF MARION COUNTY, ARKANSAS, TO SUPPORT THE SUBJECT REQUEST FOR RELIEF UNDER THE CARES ACT FOR HAZARD PAY FOR THE AFOREMENTIONED FRONT LINE COVID-19 RESPONSE PUBLIC SAFETY OFFICERS.
