MARION COUNTY QUORUM COURT MINUTES

August 11, 2020

Before the beginning of the regular meeting County Judge John Massey adjourned the special meeting which was recessed on July 29, 2020.

The Marion County Quorum Court held its regular meeting on August 11, 2020 at 6:00 p.m. at the Marion County Courthouse.

Judge John Massey presided over the meeting. All Justices were present. There was a very large crowd in both the courtroom and the annex.

Brother Heith Hogan offered the prayer, and Justice Madden led the Pledge.

In the interest of time a motion was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice McCalla to pass all the regular reports at one time. The motion passed unanimously.

Before moving on to the other business at hand, Judge Massey had a few comments. He announced that all the meeting were recorded, with the recordings being housed in the Clerk's office. Also, the official minutes were also there, and all of them were public record. Massey stated that it was unacceptable that people were being dragged through the mud on social media regarding the budget. The budget is constructed by working with the Treasurer's projected revenues and appropriating those monies into the different funds and line items. Massey continued by saying that by law we have to have a zero budget, it cannot be in the negative. He stated that in April the budget committee asked for cuts from all of the county general funds. During this time, the Sheriff's office gave 28 raises. Also, he continued by saying, that before the jail was opened the Sheriff's stated that they had spent \$660,000 on pots and pans and uniforms. In addition, \$400,000 was given from the county building fund to assist in building the jail. Judge Massey made it clear that no personnel deductions were asked for, although the Sheriff had said that he would lay off 8-10 people.

Judge Massey and Dawn Flippin had a meeting this morning and got everything under control without laying off any personnel. This point was brought reiterated several times. Joe Batterton, representing Sheriff Evans, stated that the department was not asked in the budget meeting to drop any personnel, but was given the amount of money, that the department would have to cut. He continued saying that

there was no mention that the cuts had to be taken out of personnel. He agreed that progress had been made.

Ordinance 2020-36 – Turkey Trot Friday – Sponsored by Justice Brigham. This ordinance states that since the 2020 Turkey Trot has been cancelled during to Covid 19, the employees would work a regular schedule on the Friday of Turkey Trot weekend. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice Vancuren. The motion passed unanimously.

Ordinance 2020-37 – 911 Responsibilities to County Judge – Sponsored by Justices White and Scrima. This ordinance will allow the Judge to designate the 911 coordinator to the OEM director. Also, it will allow the funding of three dispatchers to be moved to the County Judge's budget. To fund this expenditure 5% will be taken from 1801-0200 fund and moved to fund 3020. Judge Massey pointed out that the OEM director and the E-911 coordinator had been working together to put together a proper mapping system and working closing on the radio system. After much discussion with concerns including if the dispatchers would have to be moved somewhere else (they don't, the current facility is a law enforcement and communications facility), why the transfer of the responsibilities to the County Judge (without this ordinance, the County Judge cannot allot the 5% from the road sales tax.)

Justice Vancuren asked to speak, and stated that he was not anti-police and that he was only trying to help in correcting an error. He stated that he apologized for putting the Sheriff's back up against the wall, and that is was his mistake in thinking that the budget had to be balanced immediately. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Mayo and seconded by Justice White. The motion passed with Justice Madden abstaining and Justice Shipman voting against it.

Resolution 2020-4 – Clerk's Office Grant – Sponsored by Justice Mayo. This resolution allows the Clerk to apply for a grant in purchase image archival services for the purpose of indexing and imaging land record books and the Grantor/Grantee books electronically. The motion to adopt was made by Justice Madden and seconded by Justice McCalla. The motion passed unanimously by voice vote.

Joe Batterton asked to speak on behalf of the Sheriff and relayed that another pod would be opened and that 30 more inmates from other locations would be housed in Marion County.

Judge Massey announced that the \$18 fee from Ozark Mountain Solid Waste had been through court and had been found to be illegal. The monies that were already collected will be refunded to the tax payers. The land fill is being returned by to the bond holders.

The meeting was adjourned.

On August 11, 2020, at approximately 12:01 P.M., Lee Mountain repeater went down. We had all units switch over to Rea Valley Repeater. Patrol Sgt. Zeb Gilley went up to check the repeater to see what happened. When Patrol Sgt. Gilley arrived he advised that the tower lost power and the generator did not kick on and was unable to get it to turn on. Patrol Sgt. Gilley advised he would drive around to see if he could find out what caused power outage if it is a line down. I called Entergy and notified them of the outage and they advised that they would have it back up in a few hours. Patrol Sgt. Gilley was able to find a blown breaker on one of the poles and we notified Entergy of the pole number. Patrol Sgt. Gilley was able to get the generator running again. The Lee Mountain repeater was working again around 13:16.

On August 11, 2020, at approximately 17:55, I received a call from dispatch advising that AT&T called them and said 2 of our trunks were down and they will be doing 911 testing. I called AT&T and they advised that all our wireless and wired lines, except for one wired line was down. I requested they transfer the roll over calls to one of our admin lines. (The roll over calls would be if one call is already on 911 then the others would roll over to the admin line automatically.) AT&T advised that they tested all the trunks on their side and there is no problem with in AT&T side and that it was going to be on the Vendor's side (Solacom). I made contact with Solacom and we checked a few things and then they advised that they would get ahold of Yelcot and have someone come look at the equipment. Jason Davenport with Yelcot arrived and we found a FXS card that was bad and replaced it with an extra one we had on hand. We were able to get all the trunks back and working by around 11:30 P.M.

On August 15, 2020, at approximately 09:15 A.M. I received a call from Dispatch advising that the Lee Mountain Repeater was down and they have all units currently using Rea Valley Repeater. Patrol Sgt. Zeb Gilley advised that he would run up to the tower and see if he could see what is going on with it. At approximately 10:10 A.M. the repeater started working again. I contacted Scott with Valley Communications and he advised that he would have someone come look at it August 18th.

On August 18th, a Technician with Valley Communications went and looked at the repeater and advised that he didn't see anything wrong. He advised that it is not on a battery backup and that might make a difference if it loses power for a second but not long enough for the generator to kick on. He also advised that there was a plug in that was a little loose but he pushed it back in. He advised that if it does it again, if someone can run up and see exactly what the repeater is doing if it lights up or not.

On August 24, 2020, Lee Mountain Repeater went down around 09:07 A.M. Sheriff Evans went to see if he could see what the repeater was doing so we could let Valley Communications know. At 09:39 A.M. the repeater began working again. Sheriff Evans called Scott to see if someone can come look at it again and see what is going on and he advised that he would have someone head our way. Sheriff Evans also went and got a battery backup for the repeater. Valley Communications looked at the repeater and was unable to find anything wrong with it. The Tech advised that he switched out the repeater with one he brought and took ours and will hook it up for a couple days to see if he can see what it is doing. The tech advised that he would let us know what he finds out and if it needs to be sent in to have repairs done.


Subdivision. For the purpose of these regulations, a subdivision is shall be defined as:

- a) The division of or contract to transfer interest in a tract of land or parcel, into three(3) or more lots, any one of which is less than five (5) acres and all the lots are intended to be developed for individual unit of ownership.
- b) The division of or contract to transfer interest in a tract of land or parcel into three
 (3) or more lots of five (5) acres or more which are located on existing State or county roads are not classified as a subdivision.
- c) For The division of or contact to transfer interest in a tract of land or parcel into two (2) or more lots of ten (10) acres or less and all the lots are intended to be developed for individual unit of ownership. where new accessor interior roads or streets are required a formal plat will be submitted to the County Planning Board. This plat will show clearly the location, size, right of way, width and easements of all roads and streets to be dedicated when submitted to the Planning Board. A letter will also accompany the plat agreeing to build roads and streets in Marion County's Road and Highway Specifications.

For any subdivision, a formal plat shall be submitted to the County Planning Board. This plat will clearly show the location, size, right-of-way, width, and easements of all new access, roads, and/or streets to be dedicated when submitted to the County Planning Board. A letter shall also accompany the plat agreeing to build new access, roads, and/or streets in accordance with Marion County's Road and Highway Specifications.

A formal plat need not be provided to the Marion County Planning Board if the division of a tract of land or parcel a) does not meet the definition of a subdivision and/or b) when new access, interior roads, and/or streets are not dedicated or classified as County roads.

When new access, interior roads, and/or streets are not dedicated or classified as County roads, a Letter-of-Standing stating such shall be recorded with each individual unit of ownership. The Letter-of-Standing cannot be rescinded, changed, or altered unless the new access, interior roads, and/or streets meet Marion County's Road and Highway Specifications and written approval of the County Judge is obtained.



Marion County Quorum Court Budget Meeting August 20, 2020

Chairman Joyce McCalla called the meeting to order at 5:30 pm. Justice McCalla read from a document from Justice Scrima that we are still short with the budget a total of \$155,680.31. Justice Scrima spoke of his report, that we were aware of the shortfall in April. The Quorum Court put a 10% cut into effect in July by ordinance. Justice White, who serves on the Law Enforcement Committee, described that the Law Enforcement Committee requested to hire, 2 jailers and 1 deputy. Justice Scrima asked to get the financial deficit down to zero tonight. Judge Massey introduced Mr. Dozier from Dozier Accounting, to assist in our issue. The Judge also added that he would stand up for the Sheriff we need an additional jailer if we take in the additional 30 inmates. The Sheriff talked about getting the pod prepared for the additional inmates. Deputy Batterton spoke that its \$32.00 per inmate, per day and to maintain full 30 inmates for a year would generate \$300,000.00 a year and the state will pay for the health and safety of the transfers. Assistant Dawn Flippin estimated the cost of the jailers to be \$5.00 per day. Justice Scrima requested an inmate per day estimate, which has recently showed \$30.00 per day. Judge Massey spoke about his most recent comments about the hiring freeze and that we need to get it right with plan A and we don't want to go to plan B. The Judge suggested we work with the Sheriff in getting the budget down to zero. Justice Scrima questioned Treasurer Purdome if the \$86,264.51 for the account was accurate; the response was "yes". Assistant Dawn Flippin was asked to forward her latest numbers to Judge Massey. Justice McCalla questioned Deputy Joe Batterton about training; which can be completed in -house. Justice McCalla also questioned how much vacation time will need to be paid to those leaving. It was also asked of Mr. Doshier if he really wants to do this. He nodded yes. Treasurer Purdome was asked how much was in the county general account today; the answer was \$108,000. The question was asked if all cities should be paying for their inmates. Judge Massey responded it was like double-dipping, as the cities already pay the county for the jail. Justice McCalla suggested the idea of a law enforcement auxiliary, which could aid in funding for law enforcement. Chairman McCalla announced that the Personnel Committee will meet next Thursday, August 27, 2002 at 5:30 pm in the annex. The meeting was adjourned at 6:45.

WHEREAS, the Peel Fire Department has existed for many years to serve the health and safety needs of citizens of Peel, Arkansas; and

Whereas, ACA-14-284-226 provides for the governing body of the Peel Fire Department to petition the Quorum Court of Marion County, Arkansas, to become the Peel Fire Protection District.

Therefore, the governing body of the Peel Fire Department hereby petitions the Quorum Court of Marion County as follows:

- (1) The Peel Fire Department is a duly organized fire department existing under the laws of the State of Arkansas;
- (2) That the Peel Fire Department comprises the following territory situated in Marion County, Arkansas, to-wit:

Peel Fire Protection District Map as of July 30, 2020



Legal Description of the Peel Fire Protection District as of July 28, 2020

The legal description of the Peel Fire Protection District is as follows:

T 21 N, R 17 W, all sections SWR 3, 4, 9, 10, 14, 15, 16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22, 23, 24, 26, 27, 28, 29, 30, 31, 32, 33, 34, 35, 36

T 21 N, R 16 W, section 19, south and west of the White River

T 20 N, R 17 W, all sections 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, 15, 16, 17, 18, and that part of section 1 and section 12 lying west of Big Music Creek, and that part of the NW quarter of the NW quarter of section 13 lying west of Big Music Creek, and that part of section 14 lying north of MC 8047, extended east to Big Music Creek

And T 21 N, R 18 W, section 24, east of Five Finger Cove, and the NE quarter of the NE quarter of section 25 lying east of Five Finger Cove, and the east half of section 25 south or east of the Beach Hollow Finger of Five Finger Cove.

Note that this legal description corrects several minor errors that have crept in to the legal description of the Peel Fire Department territory over the years.

T 21 N, R 17 W, sections 3 and 4 which include the Highway 125 Use Area (park and marina) have been left out and section 25 has been included even though section 25 is either in the lake or is impossible for the fire department to reach because it is North of the White River. T 21 N, R 16 W, section 19 has always been in the Peel Fire territory and is impossible or at least infeasible for any other fire department to access.

T 20, R 17 W, section 12 west of Big Music Creek has always been Peel territory but has been left out of the legal description, there is almost none of this section but it exists and should be recognized. Section 13 has a small NW corner in the Peel territory.

EXHIBIT "B"

Conversion from Fire Department to Fire Protection District:

A.C.A. § 14-284-226. Conversion to fire protection district.

(a) The governing body of a fire department that seeks to become a fire protection district shall make the request by petition to the quorum court of the county, or counties if the fire department serves more than one (1) county.

(b)

(1)

- (A) Upon the request by petition in subsection (a) of this section, the quorum court shall grant the petition to convert the fire department to a fire protection district within sixty (60) days of receipt of the petition.
- (B) The quorum court shall respond in writing to the fire department within the sixty-day period under subdivision (b)(1)(A) of this section if there are issues or questions the quorum court would like addressed in the petition, but in no event shall the quorum court delay the sixty-day period under subdivision (b)(1)(A) of this section.
- (2) The fire protection district assessments shall be listed annually beginning with the next ad valorem real property tax statement and collected under § 14-284-216.

TO THE MEMBERS OF THE QUORUM COURT:

The Marion County Equalization Board consists of five members with one member appointed by the County Judge, one selected by the School Districts, one selected by Cities and Incorporated Towns, and two selected by the Quorum Court. Members serve three-year terms expiring on the first Monday of June in staggering terms. Members serve with compensation, to form the guidelines for administration of our Marion County Equalization Board. The board shall have all the powers and authority, and perform all of the duties which are conferred by law on the boards in this state as per Ark. Code Ann. §26-27-301.
