



The month of February went well for your Marina. The weather has been great, and the fish are biting. AJ has been showing anglers which tackle to use for each type of species they may be targeting. These warm water temps have brought lots of bait back into the area and has brought a lot of Snook out of their winter hiding spots.

Another species that has migrated back into Tampa and Terra Ceia Bay with the warm temps is the mackerel. Both king mackerel (kingfish) and Spanish mackerel have started showing up in numbers.

Many of the fish caught in Tampa Bay have a minimum length required before they can be kept, and some have a maximum length, too. Fish are measured either to the fork of the tail or the fish's total length. Pick up a copy of the current regulations at the Marina. The red tide has left us alone, so get out there and fish.

Unfortunately, George Martin, a long time Marina employee, has decided to hang it up. He and his wife, Lynn, have decided to move to South Carolina. We wish him and Lynn the best of luck. So again, we are looking for someone to step up and work at the Marina. Please contact me, Jim Kelly, at the Marina if you or someone you know is interested. Until then Keith, AJ, and I will try to cover the 70 hours a week at the Marina where the prices are low, and the conversation is free.

Cook's Corner INSIDE-OUT SPAGHETTI PIE



Servings: 3-5 Prep Time: 20 minutes Cook Time: 50 minutes **Ingredients**:

1 lb. ground beef

34 cup breadcrumbs

1/3 cup milk

1 small onion, small diced

2 tsp. oregano

1 ½ T Worcestershire sauce

4T Parmesan cheese

2 eggs, beaten

1 ½ cup mozzarella cheese

6 oz. spaghetti, cooked

8 oz. marinara sauce

½ tsp. salt

½ tsp. pepper

Directions:

- 1. Preheat your oven to 350 F. In a large bowl, combine the ground beef, breadcrumbs, milk, onion, Italian seasoning, oregano, and Worcestershire sauce. Blend well with your hands.
- 2. Press the beef mixture into the bottom of a well-greased 2 or 3-quart casserole dish. Press the meat up on the sides as well.
- 3. Place the dish into the preheated oven and bake for 20-30 minutes, or until the beef has browned.
- 4. Meanwhile, cook the spaghetti according to package directions. Once cooked, quickly toss together with beaten eggs, Parmesan cheese, salt, and pepper.
- 5. Remove the dish from the oven. Coat the beef with half of your marinara sauce. Evenly spread the spaghetti on top, and then coat the spaghetti with the remaining marinara sauce. Cover it all up with mozzarella cheese.
- 6. Place the casserole into the oven and cook for another 20 minutes. Allow to cool for 10 minutes. Then serve with a side of crusty garlic bread and a salad.



Kayak Launch Use Reminders

If you are using the Tropic Isles' kayak launch, please make sure to do the following:

- 1. Read the directions if you are not sure how to use the launch.
- 2. Make sure you sign out and erase your name when you return.
- 3. When you lower the ramp, do not undo both ends of the rope. Undo one side, lower the ramp, and then cleat it off.
- 4. If no one else is signed out when you return, please lift the ramp out of the water.
- If the ramp has debris on it, please hose it off.Your help in taking good care of our launch is appreciated.



Safety Tip of the Month

Here are a few crime prevention tips to help keep us from becoming the victim of a burglary or theft:

- Remember to always secure your car doors when parking your vehicle, even for just a few minutes. It takes just a matter of seconds to enter an unsecured vehicle.
- Do not leave valuables, such as purses, cell phones, portable radios, packages, etc. in plain view inside your vehicle. Secure them in a glove box, center console, or even better in the trunk. Thieves will search other vehicles that are easier targets if they do not see anything of value in your car.
- Lock your car doors while your car is in the driveway, especially at night.
- Park in well-lighted areas at night. Light up your residence. Light is an enemy of thieves.
- Keep your shed door or garage door closed and locked at night. Many burglaries to sheds/garages occur with doors left wide open. An open shed or garage door is an invitation to a thief to take anything in sight.
- Be suspicious of anyone approaching your vehicle or roaming your neighborhood.

The MOST important thing YOU can do is CALL THE POLICE to report a CRIME or any SUSPICIOUS activity. You have to be the eyes of your neighborhood. Remember you can always remain a pair of <u>anonymous</u> eyes!



Security Reminder

The Tropic Isles' Office has three engravers for use by Tropic Isles residents. They are as easy to use as a ballpoint pen. Before leaving for the summer, it would be prudent to engrave your valuables (golf cart, kayaks, boat motors, bikes, electronics, etc.). All things stored in carports and the boatyard are tempting to thieves. They should be engraved with your driver's license letters and numbers to discourage theft and to facilitate recovery.

After Hours Emergencies

If you see something that requires immediate attention (i.e. broken water pipe, red light on the lift station flashing, sewer, or electrical issues, etc.) and can be considered an emergency, but it is after the hours that the Tropic Isles office is open, please call 941-721-8888. This is the Tropic Isles Answering Service for after-hours emergencies. You will be connected to an actual person who will place a call to the Manager or Maintenance Staff person on-call to handle the situation.

Florida Sea Turtles



Five species of sea turtles inhabit Florida's waters though only 3 species nest on Florida's beaches. Florida is one of the largest nesting areas of the world for sea turtles. Nesting sea-

son is from March 1 through October 31. When visiting Florida beaches during this time, it is not unlikely that you will see areas marked or roped off where a sea turtle nest is. Sea turtles are protected by the Florida State Statutes, Chapter 370.12. Most beaches where they nest have a "lights out" policy after a specified time to prevent the sea turtles from going toward the lights.

Sea turtles can lay several nests in one season, in each nest laying approximately 100 eggs. The female covers the eggs with sand and then leaves the eggs to incubate for 2 months. The temperature of the nest actually determines the sex of the turtles. When the eggs hatch, the hatchlings race toward the water. A very small percentage of the hatchlings ever survive and live to adulthood. The female sea turtles who do survive, always return to nest on the same beach where they hatched.



Rule Of The Month

This is a reminder that the 2014 Rules and Regulations are in effect and being enforced. All residents and their guests are expected to know and abide by these rules. Each month, I will highlight a section of the current Rules and Regulations in the hopes of increasing awareness. If you need of a copy of the 2014 Rules and Regulations, you may pick up a copy at the Office or go to www.tropicisles.net to view or print a copy online.

3.8 Required Upgrades

All Dwellings must be upgraded to horizontal siding within one (1) year after the sale. Any other part of the dwelling which is deemed by Management to be in need of replacement due to age or deterioration, must be corrected within the same time frame.

3.9 Maintenance

The Shareholder or Homeowner is responsible for the overall appearance of the Dwelling. Dwellings shall be kept clean, sanitary, and in good repair as described in the Master Form Occupancy Agreement, Section 48B. The Dwelling must comply with all applicable laws, ordinances, and regulations of state, county, city, and the Association's governing documents.

3.10 Exterior Cleaning

The exterior of all manufactured homes, park models, and recreational vehicles must be kept clean and free from mold and mildew. Dwellings must be cleaned a minimum of once each calendar year. Dwellings not maintained to the satisfactory standards of the Association may be maintained by the Association at a cost to the Resident.

4.3 Trees

The Association is responsible for the trimming of one palm tree in the front yard of a Unit/Lot. Responsibility for the care of all other trees and plants is the Resident's. Management, via the ARC, must give prior written approval for the planting or removal of any live trees in the Community. All permits are the responsibility of the requestor. Units/Lots must be kept free of fallen fruit, dead trees, leaves, needles, and shrubs.

4.8 Outdoor Furniture

The only furniture permitted on open patios, carports, or yards is that which is specifically designed for outdoor use. All outdoor items must be removed and safely stored, or secured with tiedown straps during extended periods of absence, <u>ESPECIALLY</u> DURING HURRICANE SEASON.

To All Tropic Isles' Snowbirds:



If you are flying the coop and returning to your northern nests, please take the time to properly prepare your homes and yards for the 2018 hurricane season. It is unfair to ask or expect those who remain at Tropic Isles to tend to your homes, when they could be using that time to prepare themselves for whatever Mother Nature may have in store for us. Use the checklist below in preparation for your departure. Have a safe trip and a wonderful summer!

Checklist For All Residents Leaving For The Season

- Put in a change of address with the post office.
- Stop your paper delivery.
- Make sure your home has been recently power washed. The mold grows quickly in the summer heat and humidity.
- Check the skirting or blocking around your home. Be sure it doesn't need painting or repair.
- If you have a sprinkler system, make sure it is functioning properly and set the timer for the proper day.
- Remove all annuals from your garden. Once you stop watering them they turn to weeds.
- Clear carports and yards of everything that isn't growing in the ground or attached to your house. Do not leave ANYTHING in your yard.
- DO NOT leave ladders, cement blocks, wood, kayaks, or any loose items in your carport or yard.
- Trim all shrubs and trees way back before you leave.
- Mow your lawn. (If the Co-op has to take care of these items, you will be charged.)
- Ask someone to take care of your weeds and fruit trees before you leave.
- Put your garbage and recycle bins, lawn furniture, barbecue grill inside your shed or house.
- Make arrangements with someone before you leave to take care of your home should the mold start to grow on the house or the weeds start to grow in the yard or planters.
- If you have a boat on a lift, tie the boat to the cradle and tie the cradle to the pilings. RAISE your lift as high as you can.
- If possible, take your boat out of the water if you are leaving for the summer. It is much safer to have your boat on a trailer sitting on land.

- Make sure the water is turned off to the house. (inside and outside)
- Turn electric power off in your house.
- Lower and secure your awnings. <u>Make sure that the latches</u> are functional.
- Secure the pole in your carport to hold the roof. <u>Make sure it</u> is secured into the driveway.
- Make sure the Office has a current contact phone number and emergency contact information on file.
- · SIGN OUT IN THE OFFICE WHEN YOU ARE LEAVING.

Please remove and store these items inside your home, shed, or under your house. Do not leave them in your carport, yard, garden, lanai, or front planter.

- Decorative statues
- Yard/home decorations
- Lawn/deck furniture
- Pots with or without plants
- Wind chimes, birdhouses
- Flags on flagpoles, garden flags
- Door mats
- Fire pits, chimineas (outdoor fireplaces)
- Bricks, boards, pavers, ladders, construction materials, etc.
- Items stored behind your house
- Kayaks, small boats
- · Hoses, hose reels
- Signs, house decorations
- Garbage and recycle bins
- · Clothes trees
- Anything loose, not planted, or attached to your house securely

Other Helpful Household Tips

When Closing Up for the Season

- Place Damp Rid or charcoal in containers around the inside of your house to ward off dampness and lessen mold and mildew.
- Close the stopper in all sinks and bathtubs.
- Cover both the toilet bowl and tank with Saran Wrap and replace the top. This prevents moisture from evaporating.
- Spray for insects inside and out. Place ant traps around the house on windowsills, shelves, and countertops.
- Flush the garbage disposal with hot water while the disposal is running. Stop and pour in ¼ cup of cooking oil to keep the disposal lubricated.
- Clean out the refrigerator/freezer. Unplug it or trip the breaker and leave the doors slightly ajar.
- Set the thermostat and de-humidistat.
- Turn off the electricity, then the water.
