

2T margarine

#### **Hurricane Preparedness**

The 2018 Atlantic Hurricane Season is June 1 -November 30.

It is time to prepare!

A hurricane watch indicates the possibility that a region could experience hurricane conditions within 48 hours.

A <u>hurricane warning</u> indicates that sustained winds of at least 74 mph are expected within 36 hours.

It is important to be prepared before disaster strikes. Please pick up a copy of the Disaster Planning Guide wherever you see one. They include maps of the locations of all shelters, as well as planning and preparation information. Here are some important things to remember:

- Which shelters they open can vary with each emergency, depending on many factors, for example the size and intensity of a disaster, etc. Emergency Management will announce via the media which shelters will open and when.
- **DO NOT** go to the shelter until local officials make the announcement that the shelter is open!
- The shelter listing will include designated pet-friendly shelters.
- If you need assistance in an evacuation, or need to go to a special needs shelter, please register now with your county. The contact numbers are in the Disaster Planning Guide.
- Please do not call the schools or 9-1-1 for Disaster/Hurricane information. Listen for the announcements.

Please note: It is important to know that ALL persons living in Tropic Isles MUST evacuate if ANY mandatory evacuation order is given. Tropic Isles lies in the RED zone for hurricane evacuation and flooding, which means we must evacuate! Be prepared and be safe!



## The 7-Day Essential Emergency Supplies Kit (Clip and Save)

(Crip aria save)

- Seven (7) gallons of water per person
- Non-perishable food (Foods that are compact and lightweight. Foods that require no refrigeration and can be easily prepared.)
- Manual can opener and disposable utensils
- First aid kit
- Flashlight and extra batteries
- Radio with extra batteries
- Medication (prescriptions and over-the-counter), pain relief, and digestive aids
- Change of clothes and shoes
- Cash and important documents (in waterproof container)
- Sanitation and hygiene products (sanitary wipes, etc.)
- Bedding (blanket, sleeping bag, pillow)
- Extra set of car, home, and safe deposit box keys
- Emergency telephone numbers
- Pens, paper, pencils
- Playing cards, board games, tablet, computer with cords, batteries, etc.
- Camping stove or grill and fuel
- Pots, pans, paper cups, plates
- Resealing plastic bags
- Toilet paper

#### **PET DISASTER KIT**

- Identification tags with phone numbers for collars and/or harnesses.
- Leashes, harnesses, and carriers to transport pets safely and securely.
- Water and food for 7 days.
- Medication for 7 days.
- Vaccination records, medical conditions, behavior problems, feeding schedule, veterinarian information stored in a waterproof container. This is needed if you have to board your pets.
- Current photo of your pets in case they get lost.
- First aid kit
- Pet bed, toys, and treats

#### Top 10 Things to Do BEFORE the Storm

- 1 Make your Family Disaster Plan. It's not hard. Talk with your family. If you need help, go online to <u>www.tampabayprepares.</u> <u>org</u> and <u>www.floridadisaster.org</u> and call your local emergency management agency or local chapter of the American Red Cross.
- 2 Refer to the Hurricane Evacuation Map inside the local Disaster Guide. Locate where you live and your evacuation zone. Determine if and when you would have to evacuate.

# REMEMBER: All mobile home residents must evacuate, regardless of location. If you need help determining your zone, go online, or call your local emergency management office BEFORE THE STORM THREATENS.

- 3 Decide NOW where you would go if ordered to evacuate (a friend or relative, a hotel or motel, or as a last resort, a public shelter or out of the region). REMEMBER, if you are going to leave the area or go to a hotel, do not delay. Determine your route, leave early, and travel the shortest distance possible. Think tens of miles, not hundreds. Tell family and friends where you are going.
- 4 Check your *Disaster Supply Kit* and obtain any items you need.
- 5 Make plans and purchase materials, such as storm shutters, to protect your home before the storm.
- 6 Keep your home in good repair. Tacking down loose roofing, securing all loose outdoor articles, trimming trees, and keeping gutters clean are good places to start.
- 7 Purchase a battery-powered weather alert radio and a nonelectric land-line phone. Even though phone service may not be disturbed, cordless phones will not work during power outages. Cell phone signals will be overburdened, so make sure your friends and relatives know where you plan to be during the storm. Save them the heartache of looking for you.
- 8 Inventory your property and possessions (on paper) and take pictures or a video survey of your property. Store the inventory with insurance and other important papers in a safe place and send a copy to a relative out of the area.
- 9 Make sure your street address number is clearly marked on your home.
- 10 Whether you rent or own your home, review your insurance with your agent now.

#### WHEN YOU MUST EVACUATE

If you are at Tropic Isles when an evacuation order is given, don't panic. Move at a steady pace and be sure you leave enough time to get to where you will weather the storm. **DO NOT** take chances with your life by staying at home or waiting until the weather turns bad!

- Make sure your destination is not within a zone that has been ordered to evacuate.
- Take enough supplies for your family.
- Take your pets. Don't forget their supplies.
- Take important papers, including your driver's license, special medical information, insurance policies, your insurance agent's name and number, and property inventories.
- Take irreplaceable items and valuables, such as jewelry, photos, or keepsakes.
- · Let friends and relatives know where you are going.
- Make sure your neighbors have a safe ride.
- Turn off your electricity, water, and gas if officials tell you to do so.
- · Lock your windows and doors.
- Stay tuned to your local radio and television station for emergency broadcasts.

#### **Leaving Coastal Areas**

If you are leaving the area, remember to take supplies with you. Move inland away from the storm surge and inland flooding, but it is not recommended that residents try to leave the region. Roads will be heavily congested, and you run the risk of being caught on the highway without a safe refuge or running into the storm if it takes a different track.

#### Hotel or motel

If you plan to go to a hotel or motel, you will need to check for availability and make your reservation well in advance. Some hotels/motels have standing reservation hurricane programs, and some relax their pet restrictions in an emergency. Again, make sure your destination is not in an evacuation zone.

If you are at Tropic Isles when an evacuation order is issued, you WILL be required to evacuate. Be prepared!





#### **Rule Of The Month**

This is a reminder that the 2014 Rules and Regulations are in effect and being enforced. All residents and their guests are expected to know and abide by these rules. Each month, I will highlight a section of the current Rules and Regulations in the hopes of increasing awareness. If you need of a copy of the 2014 Rules and Regulations, you may pick up a copy at the Office or go to <a href="https://www.tropicisles.net">www.tropicisles.net</a> to view or print a copy online.

#### 12.6 Carport Use

\_ Carports are primarily intended to be used for passenger vehicle parking.

\_ However, unoccupied campers, motor homes, travel trailers, boats on trailers, motorcycles, and utility trailers may be parked in a Resident's carport as long as the item can be parked completely within the carport.

\_ Carports cannot otherwise be converted to living or personal property storage space if vehicles are displaced to the street or other areas.

#### 12.7 Restrictions on Parking

- \_ Each Resident is permitted no more vehicles than can be accommodated by their carport, driveway, or assigned parking.
- \_ Any area not designated as a parking surface may not be used for parking.
- \_ Vehicles may not occupy parking spaces of other Residents without their expressed permission.
- \_ Golf cart parking is allowed on designated parking areas as approved by Management.
- \_ Parking is not permitted on the streets between the hours of 12 midnight and 6 AM.
- \_ No vehicles, storage trailers, travel trailers, boat trailers, and/or boats are to be parked on vacant Association-owned lots without prior approval of Management.

#### PLEASE WEAR YOUR POOL/HOT TUB BRACELETS ("PASSES")

It is especially important during the summer months for **Residents and Guests to wear their bracelets at the pool/hot tub** to avoid any prob-

lems with people asking you if you are a resident or guest here. If you have not yet received your pool bracelets, please check with the office. Section VII of our 2014 Rules and Regulations regarding the Pool and Hot Tub/Spa states:

#### 7.2 Pool and Hot Tub/Spa Passes

All Residents and their Guests must display Tropic Isles "pool passes" when using the pool and hot tub/spa facilities. Each Resident will be issued 1 "pool pass". Temporary "pool passes" are available at the office for Guests. Residents must sign for the pool passes for their Guests. A proper ID is required to obtain pool passes. A fee may be charged for the replacement of lost "pool passes".

#### PLEASE REMEMBER TO SHOWER BEFORE ENTERING THE POOL

Our 2014 Rules and Regulations state: **7.5 Shower** 







The State of Florida requires all persons using a public pool or hot tub/spa to shower immediately before entering the pool and hot tub/spa. (FS 64E- 9.008) No shampoo or soaps are permitted in the pool or hot tub/spa deck area.

Our shower at the pool is tucked behind the palm tree on the west side of the pool near the boat docks. (It is disguised as a palm tree and after a minute or so gives you a nice warm shower to remove any soaps or oils on your skin which keeps the water in the pool and spa cleaner.)

#### Summer Construction In Bradenton

These are few of the latest construction projects getting underway that will keep downtown under construction until at least the end of 2018 and may affect you.

1. Construction of the new \$12 million City Centre parking garage began on Monday, April 16 with the closure of the Bradenton City Hall parking lot — and its hundreds of parking spaces. Workers began demolishing the parking lot and what used to be the home of the Manatee Chamber of Commerce in May, which has relocated to temporary offices until the garage is completed. The Chamber then will move into space on the new building's east side. It is about an eight-month long project and should be completed in December.

The parking garage will have about 400 parking spaces, with 100 reserved for use by the Spring Hill Suites hotel under construction on the riverfront. The \$17 million Spring Hill Suites should be completed in November.

With more than 200 parking spaces being temporarily removed from downtown, the city still has more than 1,000 public spaces available, though many require a permit on weekdays. According to Carl Callahan, economic development director, the public's best options during the week will be the Manatee County Administration parking garage, on 10th Street West north of Manatee Avenue West, which has 100 spaces, as well as the city's Judicial Center parking garage at 615 12th St. W., which has 200 spaces.

Only a few of those up next to the building are reserved, the rest is for public parking. People get confused over there, but the spaces on the asphalt and the shell are all available. That lot is probably going to be the best and guickest for anyone looking to walk into downtown. There are also a few dozen parking spaces across from Sage Biscuit on Manatee Avenue and 13th Street East.

All public parking is free on the weekends, including in the garages. On-street parking is always free, but it is typically limited to one or two hours during the weekdays. So, most drivers probably won't be affected since the bulk of the City Hall lot is used by city employees.

- 2. The Florida Department of Transportation is expected to start work on a revamp of the intersection of Third Avenue West and Ninth Street West. Callahan said the city has not heard from FDOT regarding an exact start date. The \$1.52 million project includes widening the walking trail over the Green Bridge, adding a dedicated southbound right-hand turn lane on Ninth Street West at Third Avenue, decreasing the lane and median sizes, and repaving much of Ninth. The \$1.5 million Ninth Street West and Third Avenue intersection improvement could begin any day.
- 3. The first phase of the \$12 million South Florida Museum expansion has begun and is expected to be completed by the end of the year.
- 4. The FDOT and CSX Railroad crossing on Manatee Avenue West just west of Third Street West began May 31. Access to downtown Bradenton on Manatee Avenue West will be blocked at the crossing for 30 days.


