“WHO IS THIS . . .?”

All around us are signs of the changing season: blooming flowers, sunlight earlier and later in the day, budding trees, and pollen-covered cars. In church we see our Lenten baptismal water drops increasing, “water” increasingly flowing forth from containers, and more leaves on the prayer tree. We are approaching the darkness of Holy Week while simultaneously, excitedly planning Easter festivities. One cannot fully appreciate the new life of the risen Christ separate from the death of Jesus.



As I navigate the journey of Lent I find myself looking, I believe, too eagerly for Easter. I wonder if this parallels my sense of Advent’s journey in this interim.

The journey to Easter begins in Advent with powerful images of Christ returning to bring completion to the fulfillment of God’s Kingdom. Jarring, urgent proclamations turn into the voice of one crying out in the wilderness that one is coming who is the Messiah. Angels announce the unexpected birth of a baby to a couple who have not yet lived with one another, changing the direction of the future they had envisioned for themselves. This birth isn’t just for the couple – angels provide a personal birth announcement to shepherds in the midst of their work life. The question arising seeks to answer, “Who is this child? What does this mean?”

In Epiphany we travel through stories that provide glimpses that reveal a divine nature of this now grown man. And still the question: “Who is this?” In Lent this Jesus travels throughout his community – and beyond – inviting people to follow him, gathering a community of disciples who witness the healings, miracles, teachings, and controversy that surround Jesus. The question challenges us more deeply. “Who is this man?” We see a message that is so radical that it threatens leaders to the point where they choose to kill Jesus rather than risk having their lives disrupted. “Who is this?” A lone Roman soldier declares, “Truly, this man is God’s Son.” Jesus’ death shatters those who had believed that he brought something new to the world – and with his death, now it could never happen.

Ah Easter, that moment when the depth of loss weighs his family and followers to the point of despair, a joyous revelation: It is Jesus' death that brings something new into the world! New Life!! New Life!! Who is this? This is God's own Son!!! The Word Made Flesh!

Have we answered that question we've been asking about since Advent? Where is God leading us as a congregation? What ministries might God be asking us to do in our community? And beyond? God has opened doors into new directions in this past year – HART, Winter Sanctuary, Care Givers Support. I want to know your answer. Do you feel God is leading us to these? Do you believe these are ministries God is asking of us? To be a light in the Citrus Heights Community?

I would like to have a Congregational Conversation to discuss this – honestly. Not a conversation where you share what I might want to hear, but a conversation that grapples with an understanding of Who is Advent in this time and place? I also want this be a conversation of the LARGER congregational body – the worshipping and extended Advent community, not just a smaller subsection.

The Call Committee and I are tentatively asking you to stay after worship either April 23rd (the Sunday after Easter) or April 30th. Please begin to ask yourself if you feel Advent has a clearer sense of where God is leading the congregation. I'm proud to be a part of this journey!

2 Choices for You:

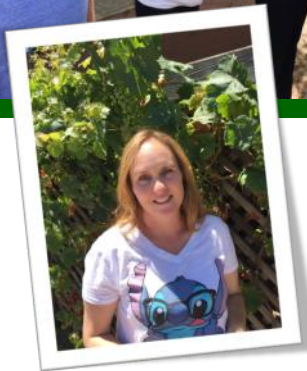
1:00 pm—2:00 pm or from 6:15 pm—7:00 pm

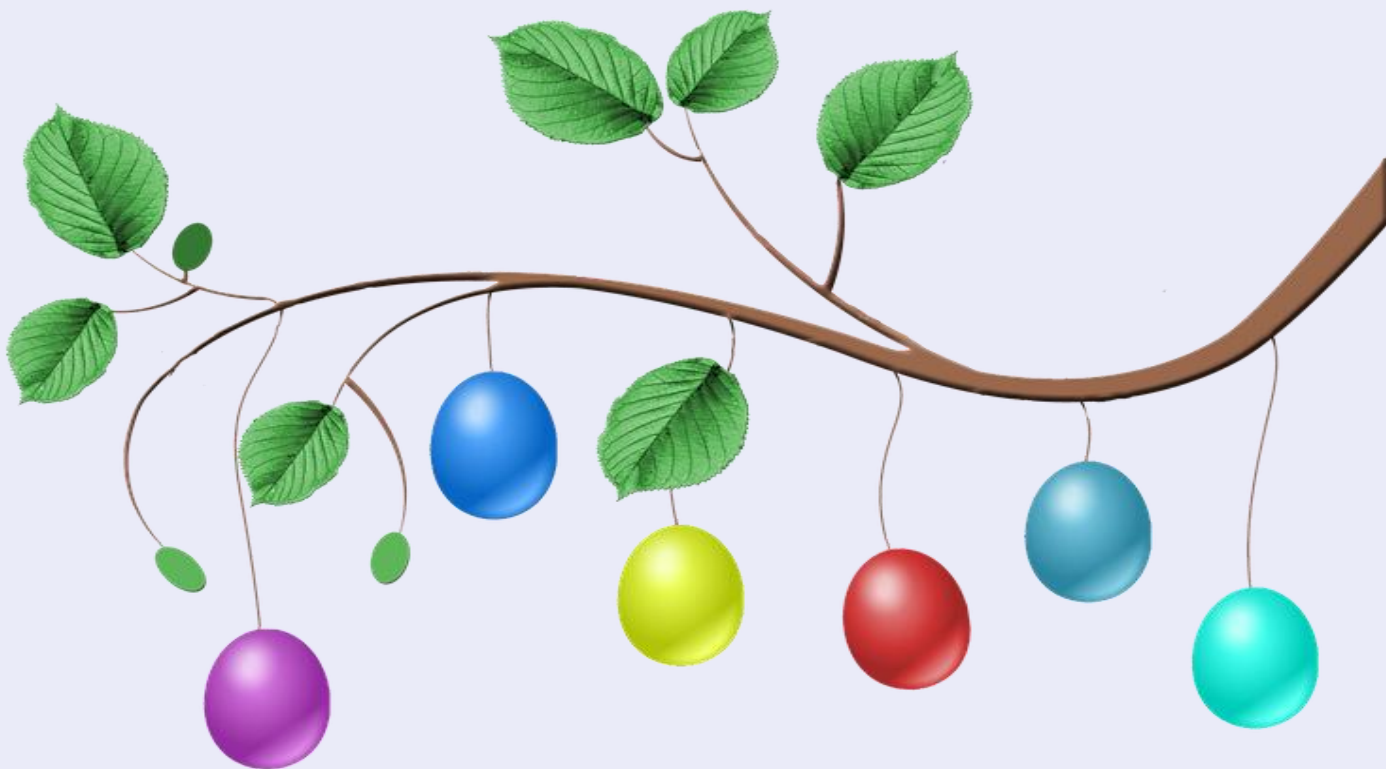

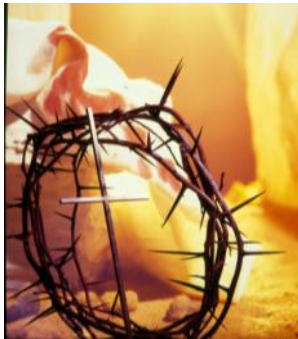

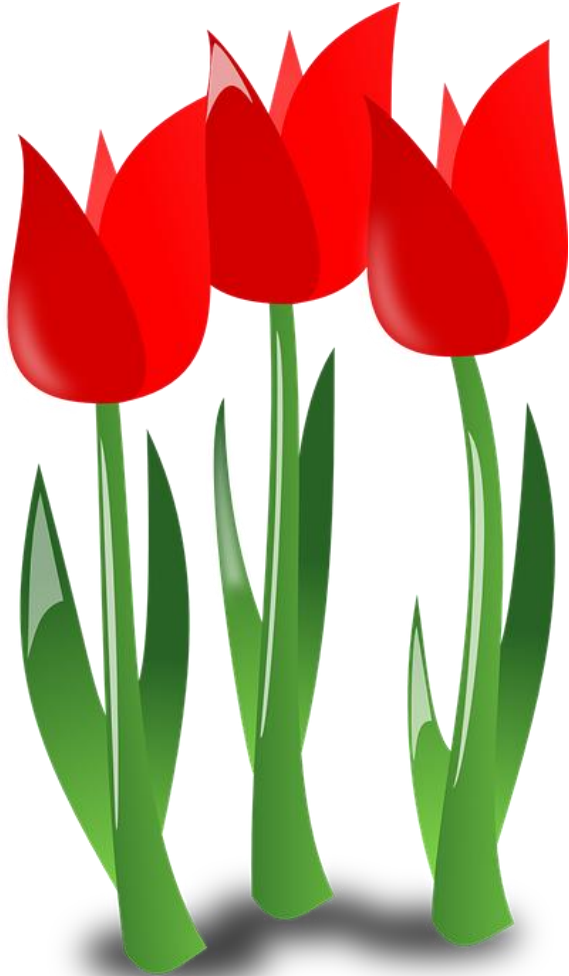
