

SCHEDULE 2

Agreed Local Decision Making (LDM) Wellness Domains or Priorities

Schedule 2 lists the Wellness Domains (or priority service delivery areas) that are agreed by the NT Government and Tangentyere Council Aboriginal Corporation (TCAC) for control and responsibility to be transferred to the town camp people in the next nine (9) years.

Schedule 2 outlines for each individual Wellness Domain:

- Responsible NT Government agency or agencies, relevant work unit and role.
- Applicable legislative and regulatory requirements, applicable government policies, procedures, protocols.
- Existing resources (services, programs, assets, funding, capacity).
- Potential third party resources, and areas for collaboration and innovation (e.g. other non-government organisations (NGOs), private sector, Commonwealth).
- Whether the services are essential services / minimum service expectations.
- Legal entity or entities (e.g. Aboriginal corporations, NGOs, incorporated associations) that will likely be entering into subsequent contracts (such as funding agreements, service agreements, asset transfer/use agreements).

Commitments

The NT Government and TCAC undertake the following commitments in respect of each Wellness Domain, and across the scope of the LDM Agreement.

Joint Commitments:

- Both Parties commit to adequately support and resource the consultation and development of each Wellness Domain Strategy and negotiate the relevant Implementation Plan with each other, by 31 December 2021. The resourcing includes a commitment from appropriate staff across both Parties, to engage with each other regularly and meaningfully, to ensure that Town Camp residents are provided a genuine platform for strong governance and LDM.

NT Government Commitments:

- The NT Government commits to contributing to service mapping through timely provision of relevant data regarding internal and external services funded by the NT Government, including the relevant funding envelope.
- Engage the Commonwealth Government to include its support.

Tangentyere Council Aboriginal Corporation Commitments:

- TCAC commits to conducting an extensive consultation, working across households in each Town Camp, to develop a robust strategy for each Wellness Domain, which will be used to negotiate with the NT Government a detailed Implementation Plan, articulating short, medium and long term outcomes.
- TCAC will gain and maintain accreditation under ISO 9001:2015 for the period of the LDM Agreement.

Wellness Domain Implementation Plans, once negotiated, will be attached to this Agreement as additional schedules.

Each Wellness Domain Implementation Plan will articulate, in a separate schedule (3.1 – 3.7):

- background (where applicable);
- outcome sought;
- service delivery model proposed to facilitate control by Town Campers;
- timeframe for agreement of Implementation Plan; and
- any domain-specific commitments or other provisions.
