PLANTING BARE ROOT

URSERY Timing and prep work are the keys to your success when planting bare root plants.

1) Make sure the roots of your tree, rose, or cane fruit never dry out. Ideally soaking them in a bucket of water overnight will insure they are moist.

- 2) Prep your soil by amending with a good quality compost. We recommend <u>G&B Compost</u>. Generally a 50/50 mix is perfect. Never plant in straight compost as it is too hot.
- 3) Sprinkle a quality starter fertilizer at the bottom of the hole, such as **<u>Dr. Earth</u> <u>Root Zone</u>** starter fertilizer encourage root growth as well as your success rate.
- 4) Look for broken roots or canes and prune off. Don't be afraid as pruning encourages healthy growth.
- 5) When appropriate, mound up soil at the bottom of your hole to support the root system. This is especially important with trees and roses.
