- EOH participated in Open Doors on May 4th receiving 3-400 people great success in making the House known to the community.
- Choir at St. Marks on May 11 (Police/Indigenous Women) was a sold-out event!
- Cheryl Bear sang at Dundas Baptist Church but few of the EOH women were able to attend.
- House is waiting for 2 residents coming.

#### 5f Routes Youth Centre -

- Rosemary Horsewood reports that a Baby Sitting Course will again be held at Routes this summer (July - 2 courses, August - 1 course) Registration on line.
- Summer trips are being planned for the Youth looking to the community to help sponsor (Rosemary will bring costs to the June meeting)
- Some of the youth (over 13 yrs) will help out at the Canadian Open (Ancaster) promoting Zero Waste. So they will help in 2 tents to recycle any waste created at this event.

#### 5g Dundas Community Services -

- More volunteers are needed for Friendly Calling, Friendly Visitors and Meals on Wheels.

#### 5h EcoWham

- Wayne Poole told us about the 'Sweet Potato Project' (sent out to all members) a group of
  environmentalists are encouraging people to abstain from meat for 1 day, June 12, 2019
  (on line registration to do this) and learn about the environmental problems we create due
  to the amount of meat we eat in North America and the health advantages of a plant based
  diet.
- EcoWHam meets tomorrow planning to have Ian Graham (a farmer, Extinction Rebellion) speak at a public event in the Fall on how to reduce our carbon footprint.
- CREW Community Resilience to Extreme Events Mary Anne Tangney reported that 4 ADC members & 1 member of Dundas Works attended the launch of CREW: "The First 72 Hours" on April 25 downtown Hamilton. The emphasis was that every citizen is 'on their own' for the first 72 hours of any catastrophic emergency and that we need to be prepared in terms of ourselves, our families and our communities. Also discussed was how the community will look out for the most vulnerable citizens who will be most at risk of homelessness, injury or death. Speakers included personnel from Emergency Services, Declaration of a Climate Emergency, (Councillor, City of Hamilton), Hamilton Roundtable on Poverty (Tom Cooper), 350.Org (Don McLean) whose message was "not a question of 'if' extreme weather will happen, but a question of 'when'." Discussion groups followed to talk about what we had heard and what we could do to prepare our communities. Neighbourhoods have to know what resources exist in their own community, need to have trusting relationships to help one another and communication is all important!
- The Association of Dundas Churches is a signatory to this Environment Hamilton Network (C.R.E.W).
- · Ecowham is open to more churches involvement.
