REPORT OF PRESBYTERS MEETING WITH MPP ERNIE HARDEMAN

On January 18th, a group of clergy and members of United Churches in Oxford County, met with MPP Ernie Hardeman to discuss current issues of concern. Over the course of an hour the conversation covered topics such as poverty, preservation of the greenbelt and farmland, cuts to disability and Ontario works allowances, the removal of the cap and trade carbon tax and the need for government members to understand that their decisions will affect future generations as well as people today. Mr. Hardeman, defended his government's position on a number of points, but also indicated that he always appreciates the opportunity to receive advice and feedback regarding government policies and legislation. He thanked the group for sharing their concerns. It is hoped that similar meetings will be held in the future.

New family:

(to co-sponsor with Habte and Abrhazion Zekarias) family of **Abrhazion's** sister, Sarah Hagos: Sarah has 3 children: daughter Selem, 22, and sons Fithawi, 19 and Naod, 15.

Selem and Fithawi have been in a Refugee Camp in Addis Ababa. Ethiopia. Selem has 3 years of college and is fluent in English. Sarah and younger son, Naod, lived in Eritrea and belonged to a small Christian congregation. Recently, all members of this congregation (including Sarah) 2 months. were imprisoned for Although communication has been risky, in late January, Sarah and Naod successfully crossed the border into Ethiopia. Our prayers comfort them as they await to be reunited with Selem and Fithawi in Addis Ababa!
