A Colouring Book for Lent and Beyond.

"My Love Colours Outside the Lines", was one of the hymns we sang during the **Epiphany** season at St. David's. It fit the excellent "Side Trips" series designed to widen our faith horizons. Colouring outside the lines could be a theme for Lent.

When we look at Jesus' journey of faith in and around Galilee then a journey south to Jerusalem, we see **the boundless love of God that pushed old boundaries and overflowed across long established lines**; lines intended, ironically, to keep religion strong and safe.

Jesus lived the hymn "My Love Colours Outside the Lines". Rabbis had boundaries. No Rabbi at the time, except Jesus, would have chosen illiterate fishermen as disciples, healed on the Sabbath, had dinner with a tax collector, healed the daughter of a Roman platoon leader and preferred, at least on one occasion, the light chatter of children to the heavy discourse of adults. No Rabbi would have taken the shortcut through Samaria and told a story about a "good" Samaritan. No Rabbi would have asked help from a Samaritan woman, especially "that woman" at Jacob's well, or even considered tipping revenue temple tables that were part of balancing the annual budget.

In every narrative someone was either being lifted up or put down, or both. It is what love does. A hard act to follow? Of course. You have your own examples from your own faith journey.

The season of Lent is upon us; a good time to reach for

the crayons. **GW**

Compare this with the amount you use from one of your own recent water bills. At the bottom of the page is the food menu. Imagine putting together a meal using wheat, split peas and beans. How about that for a week, or a month or for 2 or 3 years? We have just learned that Sara and Naod will be moved to Addis Ababa after 45 days: a Lent they will long remember.

And last but not least, pray. Religious persecution is a reality. GW

Good News from OURS

(Oxford United Refugee Committee)

We've received the good news that Freweini Mebrahtu has been asked by Canadian representatives in Rome to appear for an interview in Khartoum

March 25th, This interview along with a medical is the last step before clearance is granted for the family's emigration to Canada. When that will happen depends on the policy in Sudan.



More good news that Sara Temnewu and her 15-year-old son, Naod did make it across the border from Eritrea to the refugee camp Adi-Harush in Ethiopia. Unfortunately, the camp is two days by bus away from the camp in Addis Ababa where Sara's older daughter Selam and son Fithawi are. Sara and Naod would not be able to join them for three months unless they received a fax stating that they had a sponsor. So, the race was on to fax the authorities in the camp of 10,599 people, one of 25 camps in Ethiopia!

After two weeks of failed attempts to fax, e-mail and phone, we received the welcome news that Sara and Naod would be boarding a bus for Addis this Sunday (March 17th)!

Another request has come from Maryam Jafari of Woodstock, asking us

March 13, 2019 Page 5 of 7 to sponsor her mother from Iran, now a refugee in Turkey. The Jafari family will supply the necessary funding. With the application completed, it will take approximately three years before Maryam's mother arrives in Canada.

Thanks to Jim Harrison (fax attempts) and Isabella Gordy (hours of work), to Janice Landers and Marjory Martin on the committee for filling out application forms. We're grateful to Chairperson Carol Ewing for her guidance while away. We look forward to her return. In the meantime, we carry on. Glen Wright – the OURS Committee
