Sara, along with her daughter and two sons escaped Eritrea and are in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia as of February of this year. Funding is

partially in place. Over \$12,000 has been raised, with **\$8,800 to be raised. GW**

Receipts will be issued from St. David's at the end of the year.





A FUNNY THING HAPPENED ON THE WAY TO CHURCH

In the mid 1960's when female clergy were very new and very rare, my newly ordained Husband was placed 500 miles North of Edmonton. North even from our new charge was an Anglican charge and as we were arriving in our new home, an Anglican deaconess was being considered for hers. She was the first female Church **Leader** to be placed there. She was an outdoors kind of woman who had a large dog and a bluff, hearty, no nonsense manner. After she had visited each of the points on the circuit, talked to all the lay leaders and checked out the Church house, the people agreed to accept her if she agreed to come.



She thought about it and then told them: "I'd love to come not until but vou install door on the outhouse." door the on No outhouse?

other clergy had ever asked for such a luxury. Suddenly the people of the congregations were divided into two opposing camps: men vs. women. The men decided she was far too opinionated to suit them. The women were 100% in favor of an outhouse door. Families split over the issue.

Tempers flared. She remained adamant: no door, no minister. Eventually, the women prevailed. A door was installed, and the first woman leader was appointed. But, ever since, although she served there faithfully and well for years, she has been remembered as 'The minister who wanted a door on the outhouse.'

ANNUAL MEETING, May 5, 2019

It was a marvelous celebration as members gathered in this sacred place for the 2018 AGM. An encouraging contrast to the 2016 AGM when the Board had recommended closure. The "Coming Together" theme reminded members of the importance gathering and of participating even though it is risky amidst the increasing violence and



divisiveness in world today. We take responsibility our land for and for each other as we live out the

new vision for Five Oaks. These were the opening words of retiring Board Chair, Yvonne Stewart. Under her wise and visionary guidance, the Board and the Staff, headed by Michael Shewburg, with a lot of help from the volunteers have secured a confident future for Five Oaks. Rentals and programs have grown from \$250k in 2017 to a projection of \$450k this year. \$135k was spent on upgrades in 2018, without the need to borrow funds.

The Board of 10 directors includes representatives from our Vision Partners - Six Nations, Muslims.

Reflections on St David's UC 60th Anniversary

I started high school when St David's Church gathered at Hillcrest school. Three years later, they built the physical church. **Bill Butt was a kid in public school.**

60 years later, Bill, along with his wife, Karen (pictured here) recounted their experience of Church across the many places (Africa, Japan, Europe) they have been called to serve as Overseas Ministry Personnel. Without question, they experienced church as accepting community which cares for each other. Bill reminded us of the encouraging words of Rev Ken Oates, of Chalmers United, at the sod turning ceremony: 'the four marks of a church are Worship, Word, Witness and Work'. 60 years later, these are still the marks of church.

Standing out for me was the wee church in Romania on the side of a cliff which was **only accessible by rope** - but then, I thought, being physically accessible doesn't guarantee spiritually accessible or sensing the sacred. St David's is accessible and seeks to welcome diversity in pursuit of unity. It was touching as Judy Crane, former Secretary of Oxford Presbytery, read
