Part-time ministry, difficulty finding staff, high cost of office supplies and equipment, low number of participants for programs and events, declining United Church presence – are you concerned about one or more of these challenges? We are all familiar with the pressures of declining finances and dwindling membership, but the good news is we can find solutions by working together.

The idea of congregations sharing resources and ministry personnel goes back to the days of the **Methodist circuit rider, when neighbouring congregations worked together to maintain a church presence throughout the area**. In the same way, ministry sharing invites congregations to explore ways they can work together to support our shared commitment to United Church ministries.

There will be time for discussion and sharing of ideas. Diane Blanchard, Minister, Pastoral Relations will also be available to answer questions.

This is for small congregations seeking part-time ministers, larger congregations seeking more income, congregations curious about ways to be more effective and save costs, people already participating in ministry sharing and those who want to learn about it. Most of all this is an opportunity for everyone who is interested in exploring ways to support our United Churches and their ministries to come and learn more.
