# Services of Daily Prayer An Introduction

All believers share the urge to place the beginning and the ending of the day in God's hands. From earliest times, Christ's victory over death has been symbolized by the dawning of a new day and the lighting of lamps at the close of day.

When we gather in community, we express longing for fellowship with God in what is often called 'devotions'. The following services for various times of day have been prepared with this common practice in mind. They may be used by individuals or groups, in the home or the church, within meetings or informal gatherings, and adapted to suit the local context.

The common elements of weekday worship are song, scripture, silence, and prayer. The focus of the service is praise of God and prayer for the whole world. Symbols of our faith—a cross, a Bible, a candle—are helpful but not essential, and are always secondary to the symbol of the Christian community gathered for prayer. The sense of community is heightened when worshippers stand or sit in a circle. Leadership may be offered from within the circle or from a lectern. It is intended that the services be led by one or more lay persons.

**Songs**, hymns, responses, and the Lord's Prayer may all be sung, with or without accompaniment. Singing together is a powerful expression of faith.

One or more passages of **scripture** may be read. The scripture chosen should encourage praise and prayer.

**Silence** for the purpose of meditation and reflection is recommended following a reading from scripture. A commentary or brief meditation may be offered, but is not essential. In response to a reading, a hymn or verse of a hymn may also be sung, the people remaining seated.

**Prayer** may be offered in the personal words of the leader or read from among the prayers provided. Within the prayers of thanksgiving and intercession, worshippers are invited to name particular people or events. Material in square brackets may be included as appropriate. Careful explanation, perhaps prior to the service, will help worshippers enter more fully into the prayers.

When Daily Prayer for Late Afternoon or Evening begins with Thanksgiving for Light, the Opening Sentences, Prayer, and Evening Hymn are omitted.

As we offer praise and prayers by day or at dusk, may we find afresh the power of the resurrection in our common life in Christ.

## Daily Prayer for Morning or Mid-Day Devotions

#### **Opening Sentences**

All occasions
O God, open my lips,
and my mouth shall proclaim your praise. (Psalm 51)

In the morning
I pray to you, O God;
you hear my voice
in the morning;
at sunrise I offer my prayer
and wait for your answer.

(Psalm 5)

At mid-day
Those who wait for God
shall renew their strength,
they shall mount up
with wings like eagles;
they shall run and not be weary,
they shall walk and not faint.
(Isaiah 40)

#### Prayer

Morning
Let us pray:

Holy God,
you call us together
to reflect on your Word,
and our life in your world.
Be with us now
as we sing and pray together,
that we may hear your voice
and understand your way.
This we pray through
Jesus, the Christ. Amen.

Mid-day Let us pray:

Sustaining God,
in the midst of our day,
and embraced by your world,
we call upon your wisdom;
we draw upon your strength;
we rely upon your grace.
Help us to continue faithfully in your way,
by the power of the Holy Spirit
and in the name of Jesus. Amen.

#### Hymn and/or Psalm

A hymn, if included, will be chosen to suit the time of day or occasion. A psalm for the morning (one of psalms 51, 63, 67, or 95) or another is always appropriate.

#### Scripture

At the end of the reading, the reader may say:

Hear what the Spirit is saying to the church.

or The word of God.

Thanks be to God.

#### Silent reflection

Silence may be followed by a variety of responses, such as action, music, or words.

A Scripture Song (see pages 900, 901) may be sung.

### Prayers of Thanksgiving and Intercession

One of the following prayers (A or B) or another may be offered. At various points during the prayers, a sung response may be used (see 948–954).

#### **Thanksgiving**

Generous and loving God,

we thank you for your blessings without number.

We bless you for the beauty of creation:

for day and night, for summer and winter;

for sun and rain, for seed-time and harvest;

for your bounty supplying all our needs.

We bless you for protecting us in our weakness,

and renewing our strength of spirit;

for guiding us as we resist evil,

and calling us to your truth, and to your service.

We praise you for sending Jesus to be among us:

for his life on earth, his sufferings and death,

for his resurrection to new life, and the gift of the Holy Spirit.

Grant, O God, that our hearts may grow in thankfulness

for these and all your gifts of grace,

so that as the people of new life, we may proclaim your praise;

[in Jesus' name. Amen.]

#### Intercessions

Each portion of the prayer may conclude: Gracious God, hear our prayer; and in your love, answer.

Compassionate God,
hear us as we pray:
for your church and its varied ministries . . .
for the work of justice and the healing of creation . . .

for the care of strangers, neighbours, family, friends . . .

for those isolated by sickness, sorrow, violence, fear . . . for those broken by the world . . .

for those who face death . . .

Generous and compassionate God, in your loving purpose, answer our prayers and fulfil our hopes; and in all things for which we pray, give us grace and wisdom to accept your will, for the sake of Jesus Christ. **Amen.**

#### **Thanksgiving**

Bountiful God, we lift our voices in prayers of praise, for you have raised us to new life in Jesus Christ, and your blessings to us and to your world come in generous measure.

In our hearts and with our voices, we name before you that for which we give thanks:

Specific events and people may be named.

#### Intercessions

Each portion of the prayer may conclude: Gracious God, hear our prayer; and in your love, answer.

Merciful God, you are close to all in need, and by our prayers we draw close to you. Claiming your love in Christ Jesus for the whole world, we dare to pray for others. Committing ourselves to care in his name for those around us, we bring our prayers and concerns for friend and stranger:

Prayers for people and events, both near and far, may be offered.

Gracious God, hear our prayer, And in your love, answer.

Bountiful and merciful God, accept the prayers of your people, and strengthen us to do your will; through Jesus Christ. **Amen.** 

## Lord's Prayer

With Jesus, we pray together, saying:

Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name.
Your kingdom come,
your will be done
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread
Forgive us our sins, as we forgive
those who sin against us.

## Daily Prayer For Late Afternoon or Evening Devotions

The service begins with either Thanksgiving for Light or Opening Sentences

#### Thanksgiving for Light

After all have gathered, a candle is lit in the midst of the community.

Light and peace in Jesus Christ! Thanks be to God.

or

Jesus Christ, you are the light of the world, light shining in deepest night, which cannot overcome it. Stay with us now, for it is evening; the day is almost over.

Let us pray:

We give you thanks and praise, O God of endless light, through our Saviour, Jesus Christ. In him your light shines in our hearts and reveals the light that never fades. As daylight comes to an end and darkness begins to fall, we thank you for the light of day created for our work and pleasure, and bless you for the gift of this evening light. All praise to you, O God, through Iesus Christ, in whom all glory and honour is yours, with the Holy Spirit, in the holy church

now and forever. Amen.

### **Opening Sentences**

Our help is in the name of God, who made heaven and earth.

Let us give thanks to our sovereign God who is worthy of all thanksgiving and praise.

#### Prayer

Let us pray:

Loving God, in whose mercy we find our peace, in whose presence we find our place, in whose world we find our calling: grant us grace to hear and accept your Word, that we may be faithful followers of your will and your way all our days. In Jesus' name we pray. Amen.

or

Let us pray:

O God, our Guide and Companion, you have brought us through this day to a time of reflection and rest. Calm our souls. and refresh us with your peace. In Christ, draw us closer to one another in the bonds of his love. We pray in the power of the Spirit. Amen.

## Hymn to Christ the Light Hymn

A psalm for evening (one of Psalms 23, 51, 63, 141) or another is always appropriate.

#### Intercessions

Each portion of the prayer may conclude: Gracious God, hear our prayer; and in your love, answer.

Mighty and tender God,
hear us as we pray,
for you bring release to the captives and rest to the weary,
and you know the way of suffering in Jesus Christ our Saviour.
We pray:

for the church throughout the world in its life and ministries . . . for the nations as they strive for peace and justice . . . for all who suffer: the sick, the sorrowful, the lonely, the oppressed . . . for peaceful relationships among friends, among strangers . . .

Tender and mighty God, in your loving purpose answer our prayers and fulfil our hopes.

In all things for which we pray, give us the grace and wisdom to accept your will, for the sake of Jesus Christ. Amen.

In Jesus Christ, your saving love scattered the power of death and your eternal light shines in the darkness.

With confidence, we remember before you the suffering of humanity and the brokenness of the world.

Especially today we pray for . . .

Specific prayers for people and events, near and far, may be named.

Holy and compassionate God, accept the prayers of your people, and strengthen us to do your will; through Jesus Christ. **Amen.** 

#### Lord's Prayer

With Jesus, we pray together saying:

Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name.
Your kingdom come,
your will be done
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins, as we forgive
