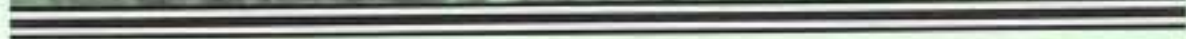

Dear Customer

It gives me great pleasure in presenting our catalogue of Superior Grass seed mixtures and agricultural products for 2011.

This past year has seen encouraging improvements in returns from milk and cereal production but unfortunately this has been accompanied by huge rises in the basic costs of fuel and fertiliser. 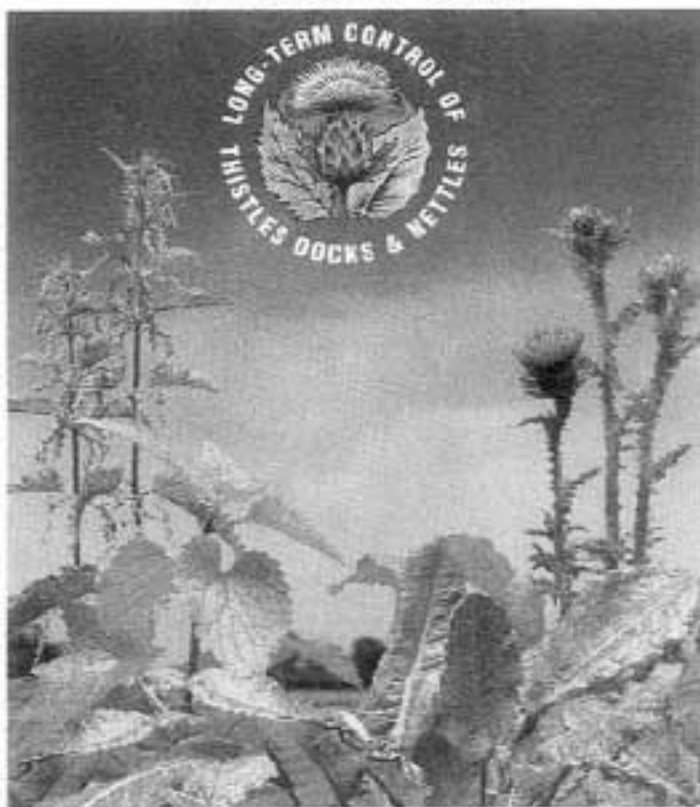
