Chapelgarth is an Edwardian house with generous, mature gardens and its own extensive fields.

Built in 1909 by Major Clive Dixon, a soldier and a notable artist and illustrator, the house was home to his six children. Major Dixon drew up the plans for the house before leaving to fight in the Boer War where he also pursued his interest in painting. Legend has it that Major Dixon was so fond of his horse that he brought it back from South Africa to be buried in the grounds at Chapelgarth. Major Dixon lived at the house for a very short time but was killed in the 1st World War at Ypres.

He was married to Lilian Margaret Bell – herself a talented artist. In 1964, the house was bought by the Sutcliffe family, who still own it.

Approached through a long drive of poplar and lime trees, the house has plenty of outdoor spaces, including a walled garden, an open lawn and a courtyard, all of which can be used as a blank canvas for your dream wedding. We have recently refurbished our beautiful Artist's Studio and transformed it into a stunning space, ideally suited for your legal wedding ceremony seating up to 70 guests. Alternatively the room can also be used to accommodate your drinks reception, should the weather be unkind.

Along with our 8 bedrooms, sleeping 17 guests, we have two drawing rooms within the house that you can use for your legal wedding ceremony, both seating up to 50 guests. Following your ceremony you may wish to hold your drinks reception on the main lawn overlooking the stunning countryside and/or within the house.

What else?

2 months prior

1 month before
