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Who We Are

Our agency assists people with developmental disabilities in achieving their personal goals, independence, and productivity within the community. We provide them with the following types of programs and services:

- Financial
- Residential
- Recreational
- Vocational
- Educational

- **Residential Housing** offers varying levels of supervision in a home setting for individuals with developmental disabilities.
- **Personal Supports** provides individuals with the support necessary to enable them to live in their own homes.
- **Individual Family Services** include respite services, transportation, environmental modifications, adaptive equipment, money management and home skills.
- **Family Support Services** are designed to help families with children who have developmental disabilities. Personalized services address the emotional, physical and financial demands that they face.
- **Mentoring** services carefully match an individual with a mentor. Services are tailored to the recipient's needs, abilities, preferences, and interests.



- **Financial Assistance** (Low Intensity Support Services, or LISS) are designed to enable a family to provide for the needs of a loved one with developmental disabilities.
- **Vocational Services** places developmentally disabled adults in appropriate jobs and offers continuous job training, supervision, and follow-up at no cost to the employer.
- **Kids on the Block Puppet Program** provides disability awareness by teaching elementary school children about epilepsy.
- **School Alert** is a program by the Epilepsy Foundation designed to inform teachers and other adult members of the school community about epilepsy so they will know what to do if a child has a seizure.
