BAD SECRETS - Info for children about being safe

This info is for anyone UNDER 16 years of age.

If you are 16 years or older, you should read our fact sheet 8 called 'Adult Sexual Assault'.

Sexual abuse is a crime, it is against the law!

What is sexual abuse?

Sexual abuse is when someone uses their power to do sexual things with you. It might make you feel yucky, scared, dirty or confused.

If you are UNDER 16 years of age you CANNOT agree to have sex or do sexual things.

The law says that because of your age, you can't agree or 'consent' even if you think you are ok with it.

You've done nothing wrong by thinking you've agreed.

Sexual abuse can include when someone:

- shows you their bum, penis, breasts, vagina or rubs themselves (masturbates) in front of you.
- films or takes photos of you in a sexual way.
- makes you look at sexual pictures on a computer, TV, in a magazine or on a phone.
- or breasts OR makes you touch them there.
- has sex with you, including putting a penis or finger inside your body.

It is never your fault.

No-one has the right to do sexual things to you.

No-one has the right to trick you or make you do sexual things with them.

Who abuses children?

It could be someone like friends, teachers, coaches, neighbours, family or someone else you know.

It might be a stranger (but hardly ever).

How does abuse happen?

Sometimes the person will use tricks and buy you stuff to get your trust. They will then get you to do sexual things.

If this happens, you might feel yucky and shame.

Bad secrets

- The person who is hurting you can be sneaky and really nice so no one guesses the bad secret.
- They might tell everyone you're a liar to make them look good.
- The person might make threats so you won't tell anyone about the bad secret.

The person might say:

"You better not tell or you'll get into trouble!" or

"If you tell anyone, DoCS will take you!"
(DoCS is now called 'Community Services')
