


A Service for the Worship of God Christmas Eve December 24, 2020 at 5:00 PM

In the name of Christ and bids you welcome.



The angels filled the skies praising God and proclaiming:



LITANY OF LIGHT

2nd Reader: You have multiplied the nation, you have increased its joy; they rejoice before you as with joy at the harvest, as people exult when dividing plunder.

Many know the 1969 song written by George Harrison, "Here Comes the Sun." Part of the lyrics feature these words:

"Here comes the sun ...
It's been a long cold lonely winter.
It feels like years since it's been here.
Here comes the sun.
The smiles returning to the faces...
I feel that ice is slowly melting.
It seems like years since it's been clear.
Here comes the sun."

Imagine those awaiting the arrival of the Messiah over 2,000 years ago who felt the bitterness of cold in their hearts. They looked for the arrival of a Savior—Messiah who would free them from oppression and enemy occupation. They looked for a King.

How shocking to find, not a royal prince in born in palace of luxury, safety and power, but a babe wrapped in swaddling clothes and born in a stable. **God's Son** would not ride a mighty war horse and overcome their enemies, but rather would ride a donkey and tell us to love our neighbors and forgive our enemies and put the needs of others ahead of our own. He would be crucified on a cross as a criminal. Many had felt abandoned in a winter of despair. Yet through the Son, the ice melted, and joyous smiles came again to our faces. Things become clear in God's time.

To us on earth, the sun is the essential for light and life. Our solar system is formed around the sun. In many forms of faith, light has a tremendous symbolism. For us as Christians, **God's Son Jesus** – is our sun, the central and defining Light and Hope and Word. Jesus said, "I am the light of the world." As we prepare our hearts this sacred night and sing carols and light candles, may meet the coming of the Son with hope and faith. May we look to the future with smiles on our faces and feel the ice of hatred, fear, and despair melt in our world. Let there be peace on earth.
