Ash Wednesday emphasizes a dual encounter: we confront our own mortality and confess our sin before God within the community of faith. The use of ashes as a sign of mortality and repentance has a long history in Jewish and Christian worship. The Imposition of Ashes is a powerful and experiential way of participating in the call to repentance and reconciliation. This practice is the historic focus of our Ash Wednesday observance and gives the day its name.

Please use silence and meditation to begin our worship together.

EPISTLE READING


2 Corinthians 5:20-6:10
