

Her family farmed, growing certified seed and popcorn among other things. Nan and her younger brother, a retired Army Colonel, were all members of Community Congregational Church out in the country. Nan's happy with the direction our church is going. In her words, "Over the past ten years, it seems FPC has become more aware of the needs of others. We're more willing to reach out and not be satisfied by just writing a couple of checks. We're more willing to "sail" with the Holy Spirit as the breath of wind guiding us." Her hope is to see this flourish!

Nan has served our church in many areas. She was a deacon and elder. She taught Sunday School, worked on Mission, Planning, and Spiritual Formation Committees. She has also served on Pastoral Search Committees. Currently Nan is a member of CAP Service to Others Ministry Team and is a faithful member of our choir.
