FPC Helping Our Neighbor

A food drive at FPC will be held to collect food items for members of BSPC and the surrounding community in the Sheldon area on SATURDAY, DECEMBER 5 FROM 10AM-12PM in front of the Education & Outreach Building—1201 North Street, Beaufort, SC 29902

One of the things unique in the PCUSA denomination is our practice of connectivity throughout the denomination. Charleston Atlantic Presbytery is intentional about the connectedness of all of the 48 churches in the presbytery and encourages this with all churches, most especially the small churches.

Some of you may know the story of the Beaufort-Salem Presbyterian Church located on Hwy 17. In 2017 when the long-time Commissioned Lay Pastor resigned, a commission was established by the Presbytery to evaluate its viability since the attendance averaged two people when they met semi-monthly. CLP Reggie Simmons met with Rev. Dr. Donnie Woods, General Presbyter to evaluate the grounds and felt called to give the church another chance. Reggie has wonderful stories to tell about the first weeks and months of leading worship at Beaufort-Salem and he has continued the leadership there with faithfulness and enthusiasm – well until Covid-19 made it not safe for worship in the church.

Pastor Simmons lives in Charleston, and while having a catering business here, still goes weekly to check on the church, offers a "virtual service" each Sunday afternoon and works with the Charleston Food Bank to provide food to members of BSPC and the surrounding community. Distance and energy are no deterrent for Reggie – when FPC hosted the Presbytery meeting two years ago, he catered the lunch. Pastor Simmons volunteered repeatedly to provide a meal for people in need in Beaufort and in 2019 served dinner in Fellowship Hall for families from Neighborhood Outreach Connection (a non-profit FPC supports). When FPC held a meal packing event for Rise Against Hunger, Pastor Simmons and his flock came to our aid and helped us reach our goal in record time. And when FPC held our most recent oyster roast in January, Pastor Simmons and several members from BSPC attended. He has repeatedly supported us.

Now we have the opportunity to support Beaufort-Salem in another meaningful ways and share with them some of the generosity they have given so freely. A work-day for youth and adults to clean-up and fix-up Beaufort-Salem Church will be held in January 2021 (date TBD) to assist our neighbors in Sheldon get their building in shape to re-open when the time is right.
