Update From Your Building and Grounds Commission

Due to a most generous private donation, the steeple was painted in May. When entering the church, take a look up. The base was repainted white and the steeple itself was repainted gray. If you previously took note, there were some rust spots beginning to show through. We have also signed a contract to re-point the stone walls at each end of the nursery school wing. The pointing has gaps that are allowing water to get inside the building. If we do not address this, we will have moisture problems and a quick deterioration of these walls. Neither wall is within the boundaries impacted by Growing our Future modifications.

We've also had some tree work performed, removing a small dogwood that died and raising the elevation of maple trees in the lower level to make it safer for walking (or running) underneath. In addition, we've performed typical spring maintenance to our sprinkler system and air conditioning.

One note on conservation of NSPC's water, electricity and building security... We on Buildings and Grounds are very aware of the amount of water and the amount of electricity we consume and do spend some time reviewing usage and considering ways to save. Our request of the congregation is to continue to be diligent. If someone is the last person to leave, please make sure lights are turned off, thermostats are reset to the programmed schedule, and doors are locked. Please report any running water or other building concerns to a member of Buildings and Grounds. Taking ownership of our facilities will help us maintain them while keeping costs down.

Church School Chatter


Summer Sunday School




