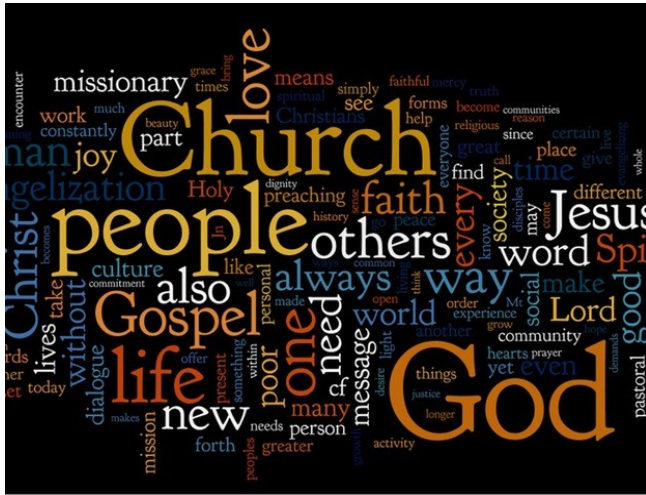


NEW MEMBER CLASS

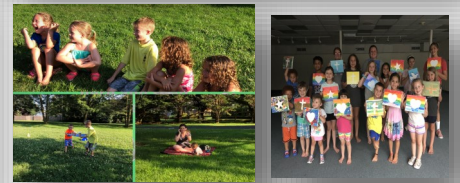

BUILDING & GROUNDS

Update from Building and Grounds

This summer saw the completion of overdue renovations and needed maintenance items. Three bathrooms were updated in the Christian Education Wing. The two located at the end of the hall, and the small individual bathroom (Jack and Jill) located between two classrooms, were updated to include new floor tiles, stalls, and fixtures; energy efficient water usage and hand drying; and ADA (Americans with Disabilities Act) compliance. Many thanks to our Nursery School, who generously funded all of these renovations.

We've also repointed and sealed the stone walls and rooftop slates located at each end of the upper Christian Education Wing. They were letting water in during heavy rains. These walls will not be impacted by the upcoming building renovations and expansion. As with all large projects we received at least three bids and chose the contractor who would be the best value for our money.

In addition, it was necessary to replace a leaking hot water heater. Due to a leak detection and shutoff system, which was installed about a year ago because the water heater was past it's life expectancy, we avoided more extensive water damage from the water heater leak. The solar light illuminating the large sign at the corner of Goshen and Route 252 was also replaced.

Routine Summer Maintenance Items Completed

- Professional cleaning of the social hall and the adult meeting room carpets
- Stripping, cleaning and waxing of both floors of the CE Wing
- Trimming and pruning of shrubs, trees, and bushes
- Nursery School carpets cleaned, funded by Nursery School



Sadly, both air conditioners in the lounge have ceased operation. Due to the upcoming renovations, we will not be replacing them. The existing lounge will be part of the central heating and air conditioning system. Please keep this in mind when planning events in the lounge on warm days. Before we know it, cool weather will arrive and this will be a non-issue.

One final note of awareness and diligence by those in the congregation:

Keeping exterior church doors secure has been a perennial issue. We have done much to replace old doors and key systems, and are looking at modern access systems as part of *Growing our Future*. None of these safeguards work if the doors are not fully closed. Please, upon leaving the church facilities, make sure doors close completely behind you. This is especially important for those who may be the last to leave for the day.

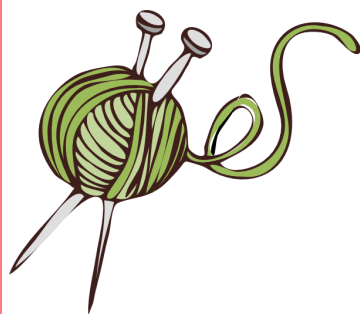
