

# Ash Wednesday Worship Service February 17<sup>th</sup> 7:00 a.m., 12 noon, 7:00 p.m.

Plan now to attend one of the three services of worship offered for Ash Wednesday. (The practice of social distancing and wearing masks will be observed)

- at 7: 00 a.m. early before the work and school day begin; *This brief service will include both the imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion.*
- at 12 noon (perhaps observing a fast with the deletion of the regular noon meal); This brief service will include both the imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion.
- at 7:00 p.m. This will be a traditional worship service that will include a message by Pastor Rhonda and both the imposition of Ashes and Holy Communion.

Since the beginning of the church, Christians have observed the days of our Lord's passion and resurrection with great devotion. It became one of the greatest traditions of the church to prepare for these events through serious examination of our spiritual lives.

The season of Lent is a time of penitence, discipline, and renewal. In the Ash Wednesday service, we are reminded of our mortality, we confess our sins, and we experience forgiveness through Christ's death and resurrection.

The "imposition of ashes" is a central part of the service. You are invited to come forward to receive the ashes on your forehead. In Scripture, ashes serve both as a symbol of mortality and as a sign of mourning and repentance.

But neither sin nor death are the final word. We leave the service in confidence and gratitude: Christ has conquered death, and nothing can separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus, our Lord.

#### **ANNUAL MEETING IN FEBRUARY**

The annual meeting of the congregation is scheduled for Sunday, February 14<sup>th</sup>. We are doing things a little different this year. Immediately following worship, we will remain in the sanctuary for the meeting in which the efforts of 2020 will be reviewed, annual reports received, and the election of President and Vice President of the congregation will be conducted. There will not be any soup and sandwich this year due to COVID.

ELEVATOR UPDATE - We had an awesome party on January 17th – I hope many of you were in attendance. Security was on high alert as our very own, beloved TP Queen graciously attended to help us celebrate. After her arrival and the "christening" of our new addition, Pastor Rhonda led us in a celebration toast. Unfortunately, we had one small glitch due to operator inexperience and the elevator doors were locked up so Gary and Sara were unable to take that ride. Rest assured that the problem has been fixed and they will get that ride very soon. It was truly a good day.

We have good fundraising news, also. The final invoice has not yet arrived, so I talked to Sean Dorsten to see if he could give me an idea of what we need yet to cover the cost. The final change order has been submitted to Garmann/Miller for approval and there needs to be a final meeting between Garmann/Miller, Dorstens and our trustees, but if nothing needs to be adjusted, we will need less than \$8000.00 to cover the total cost. The Trustees have agreed to pay that amount out of the building fund if needed. What an amazing job you all did!! In just two years, YOU pledged and donated over \$131,500.00. Of course, there is still time to donate if you want. And I encourage all of you to stop in and check out the improvements — it looks wonderful. A special thanks to Bernie Schroer for making the stained-glass windows for the new addition to match the rest of the windows in the church.

I want to thank the wonderful committee members who were involved in this fundraising – Bernie Schroer, David Dickman, Joyce Roth, and Marsha Heckler (AKA the TP Queen). And thanks also to our Trustees who have served over the last three years. This is an awesome addition to our church. We should all be very proud.



### **Musical Notes**

Our sympathy and prayers of comfort are with our Dir. of Music, Jim Huckemeyer in the passing of his beloved Cindy. This month's hymn reflection is by Pastor Rhonda.

"My life flows on in endless song, above earth's lamentation..."

The words of this familiar hymn, "How Can I Keep From Singing", seem more relevant today than they have ever been. Whether it's the cries of injustice echoing across our cities, the visualizations of tyranny seen so frequently in the news and on social media, or the ravages of the Coronavirus, Earth's lament we all feel is palpable, visual, audible... personal.

By the rivers of Babylon we sat and wept when we remembered Zion. There on the willows we hung our harps, for there our captors requested a song; our tormentors demanded songs of joy: "Sing us a song of Zion." How can we sing a song of the LORD in a foreign land? (Ezekiel 1:1-4)

Perhaps now more than ever, we can empathize with the sentiment of God's people when they asked, "How can we sing a song of the Lord in a foreign land?"

We must remember Paul's admonishment to the Ephesians, "Speak to one another with psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs. Sing and make music in your hearts to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ."

The singing of hymns each week, (suspended only in church, not at your home) is an important part of your own personal nourishment during this challenging time. There is a reason Paul and King David urged us to lift our songs to God. Singing puts "the words of our mouths" and the "meditations of our hearts" together in an outward declaration of faith and praise. Sometimes we all need to hear ourselves audibly proclaim what we know to be true—and singing hymns from our hearts allows us to connect

truth with melody. And, as the saying goes, "truth learned in song is remembered long."

The refrain of the aforementioned hymn states: "...No storm can shake my inmost calm while to that Rock I'm clinging. Since Christ is Lord of heaven and earth, how can I keep from singing?" Sing, friends. Make music in your heart. We may be in a "strange land" right now, but we have a Loving God who delights in our songs and in our praise. As we look to God for our strength, God will give our singing flight to nourish our weary souls.



This month our Spotlight is on Rich Spencer, our multi-media specialist who prefers to be behind the scenes controlling our multi-media equipment for our online worship. St. Paul's has been offering media services to our homebound for over 30 years; first starting with audio cassette tapes to our present system. Gone are the early days with one camera and microphone. Now with our advanced multimedia equipment, the learning curve continues its arc. From camera shot changes to muted microphones, Rich spins plates behind the scenes so folks at home can connect to worship. Rich devotes many hours to online worship, which requires intense focus. He enjoys the work and opportunity to serve. The new audio/visual setup better captures the look and feel of the Sanctuary, especially the live music. Rich appreciates what goes into worship and outreach and hopes this helps nourish the congregation in a way that allows us to continue to have an outsized impact on the surrounding community. 



#### **MINUTES OF THE JANUARY 13, 2021 CONSISTORY MEETING**

#### Financial Report: David Dickman

 David reviewed the Financial Report for the month of December 2020. There being no other questions, President Ralph asked to file the financial report for review by the church Administrative Assistant.

#### President's Report: Ralph Heckler

 Ralph didn't have anything to report, but passed around Thank You notes from staff members and a congregation member.

#### Pastor's Report: Pastor Rhonda

- Pastor Rhonda reported that nearly 60 people attended the outdoor Christmas Eve service.
- We resume in-person worship and Sunday school classes this weekend as well as have the dedication of the new elevator and multi-media equipment.
- Our prayers are with our Dir. of Music, Jim Huckemeyer in the loss of his wife Cindy, recently, and his son Todd, a month ago.

- The increase of deaths of members has led to graveside or committal only services due to COVID. Some have been postponed until spring when hopefully the threat of COVID has diminished.
- Building Custodian Bob Schumacher had emergency gallbladder surgery this morning. He came through the surgery fine and will be in the hospital for a few days. The Trustees will fill in for Bob during his recuperation.
- Pastor Rhonda praised Mary Holtzapple and Maddy Frankenhauser for their tremendous efforts on directing the children's Christmas program that was recorded and shown on Facebook and TSC. The children did an outstanding job.

#### **Loose Offering:**

 Jane Nuss made a motion for the loose offering for January to go to the New Elevator/Building Fund and the February 14<sup>th</sup> loose offering to be designated to Back Bay Mission. Kyle Opperman seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### **Budget and Finance:** David Dickman

- David reported that the Vanco online giving for 2020 was \$34,205.00 with approximately \$25,000 going to the Current Fund.
- Mailed the paperwork for the BP stock, but with the delays going on with the Postal Service, it took approximately 3 weeks before it was received.
- Our Paycheck Protection loan has been forgiven entirely.
   There is a new Cares Act now available with eligibility being that there would need to be a 25% reduction in income for a quarter. We will monitor to see if we qualify.
- We are in receipt of the final bill from the architects, Garmann/Miller.
- The Endowment money is all invested with an amount available if needed.

- Spoke with Tammy Sanford (member/Accountant)
  regarding doing an audit. The cost for an audit is around
  \$10,000. Spoke with Mark Cisco and they don't do audits,
  but if they did, it could cost \$7,000-\$10,000. It was
  suggested having two people sign checks. Joan Leffel made
  a motion for all checks to require two signatures (with
  signatures from one of these three: Administrative
  Assistant, Consistory President or Church Treasurer). Larry
  Kill seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- In 2012, the Consistory voted that if the current balance was over \$10,000 at the end of each year, we could apply some of that balance to the building loan. We currently have enough to pay off the building loan. Lynda Hadley made a motion to pay off the building loan. Kelly Kill seconded the motion. Motion carried.

- The handicap automated door opener has been installed this week.
- Trustees are in the process of obtaining quotes for new insurance coverage.
- Bernie Schroer did an amazing job with the stained-glass windows in the new elevator section. Thank you to Bernie, as well as Glenn Hadley and Bill Nuss who helped install them.


