RACE RELATIONS/ADVOCACY SUMMIT

{BACKGROUND} 2004-2020

The Race Relations Summit (**now the Race Relations/Advocacy Summit**) was initiated to take a close look at the progress of race relations in every aspect of life across Tennessee. The 1st Summit was hosted on February 27 & 28, 2004 in Jackson, Tennessee. The Summit looked at "50 Years & Beyond Brown 'v' Board of Education" and focused on the progress made in the last 50 years and the challenges that still remain.

The Summit annually brings together advocates and representatives from major corporations, public & private agencies, community based organization to rekindle the discussion and further explore the strategies identified the 2004 Summit. Summit topics have ranged from a discussion relative to obesity, drugs and STD in the youth community, to discussions relative to Diversity in the workplace; Disparities in Health Care for the Poor & Minority; Strategies, Challenges & Best Practices for Narrowing the Educational Divide; and Strategies of Exclusion in Government & Politics. The summit has also focused on Criminal /Juvenile Justice by discussing the evidence of a cradle to prison pipeline in the African American Community as well as presented information about the State of AIDS/HIV in Black America, How Politics Affect Economics and discussed best practices for Voter Education, Voter Registration, Election Protection and Get-Out-The-Vote Strategies.
