

The 2019 Rubbish Report is a snapshot of rubbish removed by Clean Up Australia volunteers.
In the ACT, the Report is based on the count of 5,205 rubbish items from 9 surveyed locations [5,351 items from 26 locations in 2018].



NOTABLE CHANGES FROM 2018

- Miscellaneous items increased by 5%, paper by 4% and glass by 3%
- Plastics decreased by 5%, metals by 4%, wood by 2% and polystyrene by 1%
- · Rubber remained consistent

NOTABLE CHANGES FROM 2018

Within grouped data:

- Food packaging increased its count by 0.6%
- Non-food packaging decreased by 12.8 % as a percentage of all rubbish reported, and beverage related rubbish by 8.1%
- Other decreases were recorded in counts of beverage containers which decreased by 3.3%, chip & confectionery wrappers by 1.6%, construction materials by 1%, toys and sporting equipment by 0.9%, and plastic bags by 0.3%
- Illegally dumped household items and clothing were added to the list in 2019, replacing sanitary and non-identified items

Within Individual item counts:

- Cigarette butt counts increased by 4.3%, which is 2.9% above the national average
- Notable decreases were recorded for PET drink containers [-4.5%], straws [-3%], plastic bottle caps & lids [-2.8%], glass alcohol bottles [-1.3%]
- Glass pieces, plastic packaging, fast food containers, non-PET containers and food bags all made their way back onto the Top 10 in 2019, replacing metal bottle caps, ice cream sticks, soft drink cans, glass soft drink bottles and chip & confectionery wrap

FAVOURITE CLEAN UP SITES

Parks continued to be the single most surveyed Clean Up site in 2019, yielding 33% of counted rubbish [48% in 2018]. Bushland sites reported the highest average number of items per community site at 816.

The two schools which submitted rubbish counts were inspiring, removing a total of 1,647 items.

NOTABLE CHANGES FROM 2018

- Average item counts from parks increased by 61 to 316 [255 in 2018]
- Bushland counts increased by 422
- Mixed locations recorded an average increase of 107 items across two surveyed locations
- Unfortunately, we didn't receive any rubbish surveys from waterway-based locations in 2019.
