

Kindergarten, the second happiest place on earth. It's a magical and amazing year to grow and become lifelong learners. The magic begins with

reviewing the alphabet, then studying a letter a week, recognizing and reading sight words, writing and sounding out words using the letters we have learned, literacy centers, and play based learning centers. The children love using the Smart Board and iPad which is a great way to reinforce what we teach in the curriculum. We are even reading and starting to write complete sentences. THIS IS OUR FAITH Faith and Works

My friend said Catholics think they can earn heaven by doing good works. He believes faith in Christ is all that is needed for salvation not works. Is this correct?

The Catholic Church does not now, nor has it ever, taught a doctrine of salvation by works. We cannot "work" our way into heaven. Catholics agree that we cannot save ourselves and we do not earn heaven. We are saved by the grace of God. This unmerited gift from God, made possible through the sacrifice on the cross, for the atonement of our sins, through our Redeemer, Christ.

This difference in our beliefs goes back to the reformation. Martin Luther preached "Sola Fide", justification by faith alone. Nowhere in the bible is justification by faith alone found. In fact the only time "faith alone" is mentioned in the bible is in James 2:14-25..."a man is justified by works and not by faith alone."

Paul's letters to the Romans and the Galatians state that we are justified by faith, not but works of the law. Paul is talking about Jewish laws about circumcision and dietary regulations. Jews want the new gentiles who follow Christ to be circumcised and Paul states that "the works of the law" do not result in justification; but faith in Christ. All Catholics agree that the old Jewish laws no longer apply.

In Christ we become a New Creation. As believers and true followers of Christ we must do the good works that Christ requested of us...
