










#### **Funding After Effects of Highway Cost Inflation**






### Highway Trust Fund Shortfall August 2007 Estimate






### Highway Trust Fund Shortfall August 2007 Estimate







### Highway Trust Fund Shortfall February 2008 Estimate











## Why Grassroots?

- Influence key votes.






- Appoint a grassroots coordinator.

## **Grassroots Action Plan - Top 10**


- Set up an action center for all employees to send messages to Congress.



On August 21, 2007 NAPA's Highway Bill Task Force and NAPA's Legislative Committee unanimously approved a motion recommending the establishment of a Political Action Committee (PAC) connected to NAPA. The purpose of this unsoncondum is to provide NAPA's Executive Committee background on those discussions and a request that a motion be placed on the agenda at the next NAPA Board of Directors' masting calling for the establishment of a PAC.


#### Background

On April 16, 2007 the Highway Bill Task Force met to outline a plan of action for the reauthorization of the Federal-aid Highway Program in 2009. Among the topics discussed was the establishment of a Political Action Committee (PAC) connected to NAPA.

In preparation for the meeting, a survey was conducted in early 2007 of NAPA members to ascertain their views on the resurtherization of the Federal-sid Highway Program. The survey found that that 59% of the respondents supported the establishment of a NAPAPAC.

The Highway Ball Task Force discussed the survey and the benefits of NAPA enthilising a separate financial fund for individuals and corporate PACs to contribute for the sole purpose of supporting federal candidates running for elected office and who support NAPA's legislative priorities.

The Highway Bill Task Force discussed this issue in four subsequent meetings during 2007. NAPA's Legislative Committee ratified the Task Force recommendation on August 21, 2007.
