

"They all ate and were satisfied." Why read the miracle of the multiplication of the loaves this Sunday? Here we see the mystery of our physical and spiritual realities intermingling. Too often, they can feel separate. When we go to Mass, how often we appear more ordinarily human rather than stretching toward the divine.

Perhaps our experience of the Eucharist is fairly mundane. We notice when a new sacramental wine has been selected. We feel the varying textures of the host and wonder if they'll ever bring back the one that tasted distinctly like wheat. As we shuffle up to the front and stride back to our pew, we notice the looks on people's faces and the clothes on their backs. We get distracted by the crying child, the man blowing his nose, and the mechanical sound of the air conditioner kicking in. How human we are, how earth-bound, how material!

And how good God is for entering into these selfsame realities. How good God is for proclaiming "the kingdom of God," for "heal[ing] those who needed to be cured," for having mercy on a tired and hungry crowd. How many of the crowd noticed what had been done for them? Did they realize their dinner was a miracle? How often do we miss the deeper reality of the Eucharist? Even if in the moment of receiving Communion we don't experience radical ecstasy and don't feel any different, there is a tangible reality to cling to. Our God loves us enough to become bread for us, not only to feed us but to be fed upon by us. ©LPI

Lecture offers Christian perspectives on bridging the generational divide



Students Raise Money for Project iAm

The St. Benedict Project, in its beginning stages at St. Benedict Catholic school, is designed for students in grades 5-8 to research local organizations who help those in need, through the lenses of the Corporal and Spiritual Works of Mercy.

With teacher mentorship, students discern organizations that they feel



called to assist, the needs of that particular organization and the development of a project to help fulfill those needs.


Practicing "love in action," students in the 6th grade presented their individual research to the entire class and afterward they voted on the one organization that they felt called to help.

This year, through the research and presentation of 6th grader Audrey Vendemo, Project iAm was the organization for which a service project was designed. The 6th grade, with the help of their teacher Mrs. Allegrini and the support of Principal Martha Hartman, raised money by selling breakfast before school for one week.

Together, they raised over \$550 to benefit Project iAm, but "Project Breakfast" (the name of the fundraiser)
