


Long Distance Monarch Recovered by Tom Clark

Monarch Watch, a program sponsored by the University of Kansas, is renowned for its work in tracking the annual spring and fall migrations of monarch butterflies, and reporting on their overwintering in the mountains of Mexico.

Members of the Riverfield Country Day School's Roots and Shoots environmental club were ecstatic to receive a certificate informing them that one of the monarchs they tagged on October 4, 2003 at



This individual monarch might have begun its journey from as far away as Canada, but its recovery in Mexico impressed upon the children how nature and environment are intertwined, and how something as seemingly insignificant as a butterfly can help prove the tremendous value of an urban park such as Mohawk as a valuable rest and refueling stop during an exhausting international migration. It also underscored the point that one doesn't have to be a trained scientist to make a contribution to scientific research, and that even they, as students, can make an impact in furthering the knowledge about monarchs and monarch conservation.

OXLEY AND REDBUD HOURS
