Metamorphosis, Adaptation, Change, ... It's All Good by Eddie Reese

Over thirty years ago a group of Tulsans had a vision of the future. They saw a future need and went to work to make sure that need was met. That was the beginning of Oxley Nature Center. Since that time thousands of children have had guided interpretive nature tours. Thousands of people have walked the nature center trails, added new birds to their life list, saw their first deer track, or just enjoyed the solitude of a shady wooded trail. Others have learned a new hobby; such as making pine needle baskets or star watching or making a cedar flute. The list of "firsts" is long and varied.

Now it is time for another new "first. The Oxley-Yetter Interpretive Building will experience its first major renovation. Already the old rotten cedar siding has been replaced with new siding that will never rot. It is the first time anyone can remember that the roof has not leaked when it rained. We retired the stack of buckets we kept on hand all these years. This fall, the interior of the building will be renovated. For the first time there will be adequate office space.

The public spaces will be larger and more family friendly. The Oxley Nature Center Association is in the middle of a fund raising campaign to fill the exhibit hall with all

new exhibits. The design plan is exciting and interactive. It is colorful and informative. It is going to be a lot of fun. We all have a lot to be thankful for and there are a lot of folks to thank. Without their efforts these improvements would not happen.



What does this mean to you?

We expect the **Oxley Interpretive Building** to be **closed** beginning November 1. It will remain closed for several months for renovations to take place. The **parking lot** will still be **open** from 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. daily except city holidays. Trail maps and portajohns will be available.

Scheduled school tours will proceed as normal, as will Full Moon Walks, First Saturday Morning Birding, and other programs UNLESS stated otherwise in the newsletter. There will be no Kid's Saturday Program or Junior Naturalist in November. These will resume December-May at the Helmerich Discovery Center at the Tulsa Zoo.

Staff will office in the old Mohawk Park Store located northeast of the Zoo parking lot. The building is small and will not be open to the public, but we are close by! Please call us if you have any questions and be sure and check our website and your newsletter for current information. Thank you in advance for your patience in making this transition with us! We know the future is bringing us exciting new things.

Nature Center Happenings

Do You Enjoy Children and Nature? Sign Up For Our Volunteer Training Now!

Are you still curious about the marvelous wonders of nature? Do you enjoy being out of doors exploring in the forests and fields and wetlands. The oppressive heat of summer is tapering off, and the natural areas beckon.

Children have returned to their classrooms, but on special occasions, they are treated to a visit to Oxley. This may be their first exposure to raccoon tracks around the marsh, whirlygig beetles on the creek, whispering cottonwoods, and a fox den beneath the grapevines.

Are you willing to lead a group of them on this adventure? Together there will be many new and exciting things to discover! You can sign up for our fall training program.

This four week program begins September 4 or 5 and ends September 27 or 28. Training sessions are two days a week from 9:00 a.m. to 12 noon. Training will familiarize you with our varied trail system and its natural communities.

Following training, volunteer naturalists act as guides for a small group of children for an hour or two one day a week from October through November. No previous experience is necessary, just a sense of enthusiasm and a desire to share nature with children. If you are 18 years of age or older, contact us now!

Fall Butterfly Count

Join us at Oxley on Saturday, September 29 to spot, count, tally, and/or identify butterflies. Information gathered will be used to supplement the data collected last April during our Spring Count and in July during the annual NABA Summer Butterfly Count.

With each successive count we are raising public awareness and increasing both participation in counts and local interest in butterflies. Each count teaches us a little bit more about these beautiful insects and the habitats they occupy.
