Species Spotlight: Red Eared Slider (*Trachemys scripta elegans*)

The most abundant turtle in Oklahoma, the Red Eared Slider, is easy to spot because of the dramatic red markings on either side of it's head. This basking turtle spends warm days, often in groups, sunbathing on logs in the water of ponds, creeks and lakes. Like other reptiles, the Red Eared Slider has temperature dependent sex determination. The males of this species have extra long claws on their front feet which they use in courting females. They use the claws to tap gently on the female turtles head. The Red Eared Slider's Latin name "scripta elegans" refers to the elegant scriptlike markings on the turtles scutes. You can see many Red Eared Sliders in BJ's Pond right outside of Oxley's Interpretive Center.

No Dogs, Please!

Why "No dogs" at Oxley Nature Center or Redbud Valley Nature Preserve? The simple answer is nature, and the plants and wildlife that live here. These parks are for the deer and the birds, the skinks and the squirrels. A dog makes wildlife disappear faster than the sound of gunshots.

These places are meant to be sanctuaries for wildlife and for the people who come seeking a chance encounter with the wild things that make it their home. Add a predator, which a dog is, and it immediately changes the dynamics. Wildlife; seeing, hearing, smelling and yes, even being chased by a dog or dogs, is apt to react with fear and heightened cortisol levels.

If you are a great pet owner, have your dog trained, on a leash, up to date on shots, and pick up after it, you would be in the minority. And even well-trained dogs on a leash will alter animal behavior and reduce the chances for you and other visitors to observe wildlife.

If you want to walk your dog and it is on a leash, it is allowed in other areas of Mohawk Park. Dogs are also welcome at many other parks, stores, restaurants and throughout neighborhoods everywhere.

It is wildlife that have few places to be. There are few habitats so rich in flora and fauna that are so accessible to people seeking an opportunity to quietly explore and possibly view native wildlife close to Tulsa as are Oxley and Redbud Parks. These places are for them, and you.

Please, leave your dog at home!
