- Please be sure to read and share the Jan. 30 Regional Newsletter for your region to find out how Mission & Service is already at work in your region. Lots of good information to be found!



INSPIRE:

• In the weeks leading up to the annual meeting, highlight a different area of ministry in your congregation and recognize the people who are involved.

INVITE:

 Invite a group of four to six people for a simple supper each week in Epiphany (or in Lent) and discuss faith sharing questions. Sharing Faith Dinners (www.sharingfaithdinners.com) has some suggestions.

THANK:

Inspire gratitude and celebrate love in February. Give everyone in the congregation a thank-you
card (perhaps made by the Sunday School) and invite them to write a note of thanks for
someone they know who is doing something for others. Like Valentine, they could remain
anonymous.

Looking Ahead:

Lent is coming! The Ecumenical Stewardship Centre offers this:

Lent is a season to spend additional time in prayer and study, fast, and give up something, like a favorite food or activity. But what if we not only GAVE UP something, but GAVE something for Lent? What if Lent was more than a time to think about ourselves, but a time to find ways to turn our sacrifices into doing good for others?

- If you give up your daily trip to the coffee cafe, can you give the money you would have spent to your congregation or Mission & Service?
- If you give up spending time online, can you invest it in volunteering?
- If you decide to fast, eat less, or give up a favorite treat, can you buy some healthy food for your local food bank instead?

brief story of something your congregation did that made a difference in someone's life
(testimony is best!). Don't waste the opportunity to thank and inspire!
