

English Road Pediatrics and Adolescent Medicine Schedule of Well-child Care and Immunizations

The physicians at English Road Pediatrics recommend childhood vaccination according to the most current recommendations by the American Academy of Pediatrics and the CDC. Completion of this series ensures immunity against serious childhood diseases, and will fulfill the immunization requirements for area schools. More information regarding immunizations is provided at each well-child visit. If you would like to discuss concerns about immunizing your child, talk with your pediatrician.

First visit: 2-3 days after discharged from the hospital newborn nursery.
Second visit: 2 weeks of age
Third visit: 1 month old
Fourth visit: 2 months old
Fifth visit: 4 months old
Sixth visit: 6 months old
Seventh visit: 9 months old
Eighth visit: 1 year old
Ninth visit: 15 months old
Tenth visit: 18 months old
Eleventh visit: 2 years old
Visits are then yearly, on your birthday month, until the age of 18.

Vaccination Schedule

You'll be busy getting to know your baby and your pediatrician in the first 2 years when the visits are more frequent. These vaccines keep our children healthy when they are the most vulnerable to severe illness.

Birth/First Visit- Hep B

1 month- Hep B

2 month- Dtap, IPV, Prevnar, HiB, oral Rotateq

4 month- Dtap, IPV, Prevnar, HiB, oral Rotateq

6 month- Dtap, Prevnar, HiB, oral Rotateq (if not given at 2 & 4 months) (flu shot available starting at this age August-April)

9 month- Hep B

12 month- Prevnar, Hep A, Hemoglobin and Lead levels

15 month- MMR, Varivax

18 month- Dtap, IPV, HiB, Hep A

2, 3, 4 years- regular check-up, no shots if up to date

5 years- MMR, IPV, DTaP

6 years- Varivax booster

7-9 years- regular check-ups, no shots

10 years – Boostrix (Tdap)

11 years- Menactra

12years & older- Gardasil (male and female)

16 years- Menactra (2nd dose)

18-22 years- transition to adult medicine

* annual flu shots are available to all children at and over the age of 6 months.

(DTap- diphtheria, tetanus, and Pertussis vaccine. IPV- polio vaccine. Prevnar- vaccine for pneumococcal bacteria. Hep B- vaccine against Hepatitis B. HiB – vaccine for Haemophilus Influenza Type B. MMR -Measels, Mumps, Rubella vaccine. Varivax – chicken pox vaccine. Hep A- Hepatitis A vaccine. Menactra- meningococcal vaccine. Gardasil – vaccine to prevent cervical cancer. Adacel – Tetanus and pertussis booster.)
