FLOCK HISTORY

For over 20 years, Lachlan Merinos' has selected for fast growth rates in young sheep, which is vital for modern sheep-breeders, in terms of major financial gains that can be made by selling merino lambs in the fat lamb market. This principle also has benefits in maiden ewes, with improved conception rates.

In 1994 ABC Landline produced a story about Lachlan Merinos selling merino lambs into the Sydney restaurant market. Lachlan Merinos were pioneers in this area, decades before the merino industry were selecting for not only wool quality, but also for early maturity and meat.

- 1995: Broke the record for the heaviest merino lamb over the hook at Burrangong Abattoirs, Young. Dressed 39.8kg.
- 2004 (July): Merino lambs \$128.00, 6 wks off shears (new Midstate Saleyards record).
- 2009 (May): 9 month old Merino Lambs \$109 (off shears)

We select for deep crimping, heavy cutting & silky white wools at 13 months of age, and select for superior genetics and not for age.

Originally founded on Peppin bloodlines, with infusions of Mandalay (Roseville Park) Banavie, Wallaloo Park, Charinga and Lachlan Merinos, using AI for over 20 years, and ET in more recent years.

Flock average: 18.9-19.8 mic, 8.0-9.2 kg.

The stud's sale hit a top price of \$9000, averaging \$3123.

44 poll merino and 40 merino rams offered, with 43 poll & all 40 merinos sold at auction.


Lachlan Merinos' genetics are known for their wool and carcase. The impressive results Lachlan clients are achieving has i ncreased the demand for again in 2011/12, from studs and commercial clients from NSW and interstate.

The top price ram was a May 2010 drop, sired by LM 08-30 ("OX"), which weighed 125kg, and tested 21.1 mic, 3.0 SD, 14.6 SD and 99.0 CF, and sold to Tim (pictured left) & Jenny Webb. "OX" was entered in the Victorian 2010 Balmoral Sire Evaluation. To date his P.W.W.T progeny are heavier than every other sire entered, including link sires, Merino & Dohne sires, he is also leading the trial for WEC (-70), and is now being used across Australia as a link sire. Tim purchased the ram because it had good length of body, spring of rib and bone structure.

The next top price was a double header with two poll rams bringing \$6800, both by BIG JOE 449.

A May drop poll ram, weighing 114kg, testing 18.4 micron, 2.4 SD. 13.0 CV, 2.4 SD.CF 99.9 to Simon Bahr (pictured left), Meadow View Poll stud, who said he would be using the ram in his stud. Mr Bahr had said he had seen the ram earlier in the year, and liked its wool, in particular because of its brightness and the length of staple, which made the ram a standout. He said the prices at the sale were a reflection of the quality of the rams on offer.

The other \$6800 ram was a 12 month, milk tooth ram, 97kg, measuring 19.3 mic, 3.1 SD, 16.0 CV and 99.8 CF & went to Pat and Scott Bredhauer, Lambert Pastoral Company, QLD. Repeat buyers, the Jones family, of Condobolin, were the biggest volume buyers. After the Jones' success in winning the NSW Central Western Ewe competition this year, the family went home with 17 rams with a \$3447 average. The sale was conducted by Elders with Andy McGeoch auctioneer.
