We would like to sincerely thankyou again for your support over the last couple of seasons, it's a relief for many areas to see the cycle has broken. Your support has enabled us to keep moving forward, by doing 2 Embryo Transfer and Artificial Insemination programs per year.

The onset of COVID-19 has proven its never been more important to have a true dual-purpose merino. The lamb and mutton market are still extremely strong and young surplus ewes are selling for \$250-\$400. Even though the wool market has been upset, dual purpose merinos have proven in the last 10 years that they are still the shining light and most profitable enterprise within the livestock industry. Lachlan has conducted its first annual eye muscle scanning this year, selecting for muscle depth and fat measurement, using Rick Power of PowerScan who is the only scanner in Australia accredited with both Sheep Genetics Australia and Stock Scan Australia. Lachlan has commenced collecting measurements this year and in the coming years will provide clients with results to further enhance the productivity of their flocks.

We're having an **ON PROPERTY RAM INSPECTION DAY** on **Friday 4th September from 10am**, for those of you who would like to inspect rams prior to the sale. Our **2020 sale** will be interfaced with AuctionsPlus (**livestreaming**), to make it more accessible to everyone on Wednesday 16th September.

For 30 years, Lachlan Merinos' has selected for fast growth rates in young sheep, which is vital for modern sheep-breeders, in terms of major financial gains that can be made by selling merino lambs in the prime lamb market. This principle also has benefits in maiden ewes, with improved conception rates.

In 1994 ABC Landline produced a story about Lachlan Merinos selling merino lambs into the Sydney restaurant market. Lachlan Merinos were pioneers in this area, decades before the merino industry were selecting for not only wool quality & quantity, but also for early maturity & meat. Lachlan Merinos uses **commercial reality**, by pregnancy scanning, classing, weighing, selecting ewes & rams at 10 months of age. We believe that the 1st 12 months is the most important for growth. This turns into commercial profit. The size of the sheep after this age, as an adult is not as important. Our sires' success has been exciting over the past few years with a number of rams dominating, & excelling in sire evaluations & ASBVs for growth rates, CFW, classes tops to culls, WEC, N.L.W.N, setting new standards and being used as link sires around Australia.

NB. LM 30 has a growth rate, +13.6 YWT.

Lachlan Merinos semen has been sold to studs Australia Wide, including; NSW, VIC, QLD, SA, WA and Argentina and Uruguay.

He was tagged No.1 for a reason, exhibiting all the strong virtues needed to be a real sire. He has tremendous outlook and presence, balance and bone, which a sire needs. Standing over him, you can see the width, from his hips through to his head and muzzle, which is, wide, silky soft and pure. His wool growing ability is extreme. He has it all, combining length, alignment, density and surface area. His wool is gutsy, sharp, free growing, with a very long, soft, rich lock. His ET siblings are also no fools, with industry impacting genetics on both grand-dam (Charinga Pearler) and grand-sire (Wallaloo Park Real Deal) sides. This ram undoubtedly could be the best sire we've bred to date, who has the potential to be real game changer.

EN POLL SIRE: LM 706 (TRIPLET) x WP422





A young sire, who is a triplet has created a lot of interest around in the 2019 season. We have retained him within our stud for his correctness on his feet and hindquarters, but until you open him up, is when you see his almost perfect wool, of super sharp, rich, free growing white wool. It is a wool that people keep opening up again and again. His tests show what you can really feel. To add to this young sire, is his pedigree, and his 2 sisters are also standouts and display all his attributes.

A very correct ram with width & stands square, & well on his feet.

But his skin and wool growing quality and quantity is his standout feature. A super sharp crimp, with a rich, & very white lock, from his head to his toes. I haven't seen a skin on a poll ram like this. A very special sheep! 1st progeny sold in 2018 for \$20,000, \$15,000 & \$12,000

A ram with great width & depth & spring of rib. He has great heart room & stands very square with massive hindquarters, showing constitution plus! He stands well on his feet with heavy bone. With his purity & softness all these strong virtues make him special. He has a pure, silky face & is a real wool grower with massive staple length & follicle density.

"We have been using Lachlan Rams for 9 years and in that time our micron has dropped by almost 2.5 micron whilst maintaining cut. The wool on the Lachlan sheep was what attracted me to the stud initially with their long stapled, bold, deeply crimped, lustrous, waxy white wool which is coming through in our sheep now. It looks like 2020 will be the first season for many years where these traits will be able to express their full potential. Frame and fertility are also pleasing aspects of our sheep, with hogget ewes weighing up to 95kg. Pre-lambing and mature ewes averaged 153% scanning over the past 5 years. Shearability has also improved, I recently overheard our shearers discussing another client and the suggestion was made that he should buy his rams where the Ryan's buy theirs."

SALE TALK



Our sale was held on the 18th September, with 134 of 140 cleared at auction to \$14,000, avg \$3007, with rams going to Victoria, all over NSW, QLD and WA. Another 23 grade rams sold after the auction to \$1000, averaging \$991. Stud co-principal Glen Rubie said, "it was great to see a lot of commercial breeders and studs again from a large range of climate areas and states. We continue to back up our breeding goals of breeding for quality with productivity, with most of these rams, only 12-13 months old, avg 107kg.

We shear maiden ewes, sisters of the rams in front of the crowd, to highlight these breeding goals. This year, the top fleece (pictured below) of 17.1 micron, fetching \$148.35 and weighing 12.8 kilograms, sired by Lachlan 130, sold for \$18,000, and the ewe lambs averaged; 17.5 micron, cut 10.84kg, body weight of 71.1kg.

John Humbert (pictured above), Kedleston Park Poll Merinos. Victoria, purchased the top priced ram, LM33 750 who was an August 2018 drop lamb, carrying a 19.6 micron fleece and a coefficient of variation(CV) of 14.8 percent and a comfort factor (CF) of 99.4 percent, weighing 122.5kg. Mr Humbert loved the rams dense, long stapled crimpy wool and his sound structure. "Hopefully he will breed a bit of wool thickness and keep the wool on our sheep. "This is the first time we have been to this sale, but we have purchased semen previously." I like the cut ability and growth rate of the Lachlan rams."

Volume purchasers, Mark, Brad and Carol Jones, bought 22 rams for a draft average of \$3750, and a top of \$5500 twice. The family has been coming to this auction since it started and Jones said, "We selected the rams for nourishment, wool density, wool cut and frame."

Commercial purchasers from WA, Australia who run over 20,000 ewes included Phil Corker who took home three rams.

"We are after bone and structure, correctness. They are sirey types, "We look to early maturity, we want to grow out wether lambs, we want big growth rates with beautiful wool."
